Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

- Cut one 1" strip. Subcut twenty-four 1" squares. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut four 1 1/2" strips. Subcut four 1 1/2" squares, eight 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" and eight 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" retangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- Cut two 2" strips. Subcut eight 2" x 3" retangles and twelve 2" squares (Pieced Blocks)
- Cut three 2" strips. Subcut two 2" x 12 1/2" strips from one strip. Piece leftover and remaining two strips and subcut two 2" x 45 1/2" strips. (Outer Border)

From Fabric B:

- Cut one 4 1/2" strip. Subcut one 4 1/2" x 5", one 1" x 1 1/2" and two 1" x 2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut eight 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric C:

- 1. Cut one 4 1/2" strip. Subcut one 4 1/2" x 5", one 1" x 1 1/2" and two 1" x 2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut seven 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric D:

- 1. Cut one 4 1/2" strip. Subcut one 4 1/2" x 5", one 1" x 1 1/2" and two 1" x 2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut nine 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric E:

1. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut eight 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric F:

- 1. Cut one 1" strip. Subcut two 1" x 5" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut eight 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric G:

- Cut one 4 1/2" strip. Subcut one 4 1/2" x 5", one 1" x 1 1/2" and two 1" x 2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut eight 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

From Fabric H:

- 1. Cut one 1" strip. Subcut two 1" x 5" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks)
- 2. Cut one 2 1/2" strip. Subcut seven 2 1/2" squares. (Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)
- 3. Cut four 2 1/4" strips. (Binding)

From Fabric I:

1. Subcut six 2 1/2" squares and four 2" x 2 1/2" rectangles. (Pieced Blocks, Inner Border and Sashing Patch Blocks)

Piecing Instructions: Pieced Blocks

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 2" A square. Place square, right sides together, at the top left corner of one 2" (vertical) x 2 1/2" (horizontal) I rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with another 2" A square at the bottom right corner of the same I rectangle to make a parallelogram unit. Sew one 2" x 3" A rectangle to the previously sewn unit. (Figure 1)

2. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1" A square. Place square, right sides together, at the bottom left corner of one 4 1/2" (vertical) x 5" (horizontal) Print 1 rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with another 1" A square at the bottom right corner of the same Print 1 rectangle. (Figure 2)



3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1" A square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of one 1" x 5" Print 2 rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. Repeat with another 1" A square at the opposite corner of the same Print 2 rectangle. (Figure 3)

4. a. Sew together one 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" A square and one 1" x 1 1/2" Print 1 rectangle. (Figure 4)

b. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one 1" A square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of one 1" x 2" Print 1 rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal corner triangle. (Figure 5)

c. Repeat to make a mirror-imaged unit, and sew both units to the top and bottom of step 4a unit. (Figure 6)

5. Sew together units made in steps 1-3. (Figure 7)




Figure 8 6 1/2" square unfinished.

6. Sew one 2" x 3" A rectangle to the top, and one 2" A square to the bottom of step 4 unit to make a column unit, and add to the right of step 5 unit to complete mug unit. Unit measures 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" unfinished. (Figure 8)




Figure 9 8 1/2" square unfinished.

7. Sew two 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" A rectangles to the opposite sides of step 6 unit, followed by two 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" A rectangles to the remaining opposite sides of step 6 unit to complete one pieced block. Block measures 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" unfinished. (Figure 9)

8. Make one block each for the following Print 1/Print 2 fabric combinations:










Table Runner Assembly:

- 1. Refer to table runner diagram for fabric placement guide, arrange and sew four 2 1/2" squares of assorted prints to make a column unit. Make a total of five column units. Sew together column units, alternating with four pieced blocks to make a row unit.
- 2. Arrange and sew together twenty-one 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares of assorted prints to make a pieced row. Make a total of two pieced rows and sew to the opposite long sides of step 1 row unit.
- 3. Sew two 2" x 12 1/2" A strips to the opposite short sides of step 2 unit, followed by two 2" x 45 1/2" A strips to the remaining opposite long sides of step 2 unit to complete runner.

Finishing:

- 1. Prepare backing by pressing well.
- 2. Layer runner top, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- 3. Quilt as desired.
- 4. Trim layers even with runner top squaring corners.
- 5. Join four 2 1/4" H binding strips with diagonal seams for each runner. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method
- 6. Make a label and sew to the back of runner.




Table Runner Diagram

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
