## Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to the selvages) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with a 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated.
NOTE: There are forty-two 10" blocks in the quilt - three each of fourteen color combinations. Feel free to change color combos or placement as you prefer. Each block uses two colors with opposite corners of silver gray and black triangles. These are the color combos that are used in the quilt as shown. The lighter color is noted first. Only one combo is used to show the block construction.

Block B: TERR 247 M \& TERR 247 GG
Block C: TERR 247 LT \& TERR 247 T
Block D: TERR 247 LS \& TERR 247 LK
Block E: TERR 247 V \& TERR 247 C
Block F: TERR 247 YG \& TERR 247 HG
Block G: TERR 247 LP \& TERR 247 P
Block H: TERR 247 E \& TERR 247 Z
Block I: TERR 247 YY \& TERR 2470
Block J: TERR 247 EZ \& TERR 247 ZZ
Block K: TERR 247 S \& TERR 247 K
Block L: TERR 247 LB \& TERR 247 BB
Block M: TERR 247 B \& TERR 247 DB
Block N: TERR 247 YA \& TERR 247 A
Use the FQ cutting guide to cut each of the FQ's listed above. Use the remainder of each FQ to cut five $21 / 2$ squares for the pieced border. You can also cut the border squares using the colors that you prefer. You should be able to cut six-eight $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the remainder of each FQ. You will need a total of one hundred thirty-eight squares for the pieced border.

## From TERR 247 K :

1. From length of fabric (parallel to selvages), cut four $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Trim to two $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 741 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and two $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 761 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for outer border
2. From remaining width of fabric, cut ten $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips (perpendicular to selvage). Subcut strips into eighty-four $21 / 2$ " squares for block corners.
3. Continue to cut remaining width of fabric into seventeen $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for binding.

## From TERR 247 LK:

1. Cut seven $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Sew strips together end to end with diagonal seams; press. From this pieced strip, cut two $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 621 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and two $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 701 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips for inner border.

## From TERR 247 LS:

1. Cut six $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips; subcut eighty-four $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares for block corners.

## Block Construction: Using $\mathbf{G}$ fabric combination.

1. Sew two 2 1/4" LP squares with two 2 1/4" $P$ squares to create one four-patch unit (Figure 1). Press. Repeat to make three units.
2. Sew one 3 3/8" LP triangle to opposite sides of four-patch unit as shown. Press toward the triangles. Sew one 3 3/8" $P$ triangle to remaining sides of the unit. Press toward the triangles (Figure 2). Repeat to make three units.
3. Sew one $43 / 8$ " LP triangle to opposite sides of the unit from step 2. Press toward the triangles. Sew one $43 / 8 "$ $P$ triangle to remaining sides of the unit (Figure 3). Press toward the triangles. Repeat to make three units.
4. Sew one $57 / 8$ " LP triangle to opposite sides of the unit from step 3 . Press toward the triangles. Sew one $57 / 8 "$ $P$ triangle to remaining sides of the unit (Figure 4). Press toward the triangles. Repeat to make three units.
5. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of each $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{K}$ and LS square. With right sides together, place one marked K square on the LP block corners. Sew on the line. Trim seam to $1 / 4$ " and press toward the resulting triangle.

Repeat to sew the marked LS squares on the $P$ block corners (Figure 5). This completes one block. Repeat to make three blocks of each color combo. Note: In lieu of drawing diagonal lines on each square, use your preferred method to make "sew \& flip" corners using the $K$ and LS squares.

## Quilt Assembly:

## Refer to Quilt Diagram.

1. Referring to quilt layout, place blocks into seven rows each containing six blocks. Feel free to adjust layout as you prefer. The most important thing is that the K and LS corner triangles meet to form "diamonds" in the completed quilt.
2. Sew blocks into rows and press seams in alternate directions from row to row. Sew rows together and press seams open or to one side.
3. Sew one 1 1/2" x 70 1/2" LK strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the strips. Sew one $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 621 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the strips.
4. Sew thirty-six 2 1/2" border squares together in random order for each of the side borders. Press. Sew to sides of quilt. Sew thirty-three 2 1/2" border squares together in random order for the top and bottom borders. Press. Sew to sides of quilt.
5. Sew one $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 761 / 2^{\prime \prime} K$ strip to both sides of the quilt. Press toward the strips. Sew one $41 / 2$ " x $741 / 2 " K$ strip to the top and bottom of the quilt. Press toward the strips.

## Finishing:

1. Prepare backing by piecing two widths and a vertical seam to measure 82" x 92". Press seam open.
2. Layer backing, batting and quilt top. Quilt as desired.
3. Trim layers even with quilt top.
4. Sew seventeen 2 1/2" K binding strips together with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press binding in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, to create double-fold binding. Sew binding to quilt using your favorite method.
5. Make a label and sew to the back of quilt.

Fat Quarter Cutting Guide Keep color sets together.
Square A = $21 / 4^{\prime \prime}$
Square $B=33 / 8 "$. Cut each square diagonally in half.
Square $C=43 / 8 "$. Cut each square diagonally in half.
Square $D=57 / 8 "$. Cut each square diagonally in half.
