Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with 1/4" seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

From Fabric A:

1. Fussy cut twelve 7" squares, centered on the blocks. (Blocks)

From Fabric B:

- 1. Cut four 1 3/4" strips; sub-cut twenty-four 1 3/4" x 7" strips. (Blocks)
- 2. Cut six 1 3/4" strips; sub-cut twenty-four 1 3/4" x 9 1/2" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric C:

- 1. Cut five 5 1/2" strips; sub-cut thirty-two 5 1/2" squares. (Blocks)
- 2. Cut eight 1 1/2" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric D:

1. Cut eight 1 1/2" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric E:

1. Cut one 10 1/2" strip; sub-cut four 10 1/2" squares. (Blocks)

From Fabric F:

1. Cut one 10 1/2" strip; sub-cut four 10 1/2" squares. (Blocks)

From Fabric G:

1. Cut four 3 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with straight seams, matching pattern, and cut three 3 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric H:

- Cut eight 1 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut six 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips. (Sashing)
- Cut three 1 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 1/2" x 55 1/2" strips. (Border)
- Cut three 1 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips. (Border)
- 4. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips. (Binding)

From Fabric I:

- Cut three 2 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2 1/2" x 57 1/2" strips. (Border)
- Cut three 2 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2 1/2" x 56 1/2" strips. (Border)


From Fabric J:

- Cut four 4 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 4 1/2" x 61 1/2" strips. (Border)
- Cut four 4 1/2" strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 4 1/2" x 64 1/2" strips. (Border)


Piecing Instructions:

The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations while assembling the various components.

 Sew one 1 3/4" x 7" Fabric B strip to each side of one 7" Fabric A square. Sew one 1 3/4" x 9 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make one Unit 1 square (Figure 1). Trim the unit to measure 8 1/2" x 8 1/2". Repeat to make twelve Unit 1 squares total.



- Sew one 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric D strip to the left side of one 1 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strip lengthwise to make one Strip Set 1 (Figure 2). Repeat to make eight Strip Set 1's total.
- 3. Cut the eight Strip Set 1's into (216) 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" Unit 2 strips (Figure 3).






Figure 4 Make 12 blocks

 Sew together four Unit 2 strips end to end. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew one newly sewn strip to each side of one Unit 1 square referring to image for placement of strips (Fig. 4). Sew together five Unit 2 strips end to end. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the newly sewn strips to the top and to bottom of the Unit 1 square to make one 10 1/2" Block One square (Figure 4). Repeat to make twelve Block One squares total.

5. Place one 5 1/2" Fabric C square on the top left corner of one 10 1/2" Fabric E square, right sides together (Figure 5). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Figure 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Figure 6).



- Follow Figure 7 for the seam direction to add a 5 1/2" Fabric C square to each of the remaining corners of the 10 1/2" Fabric E square to make one Block Two square (Figure 8).
- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make four Block Two squares total.






Figure 9 Make 4 blocks

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 9 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make four Block Three squares.

 Sew one 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of one 3 1/2" x 50 1/2" Fabric G strip to make one Block Four strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make three Block Four strips total.



- 10. Sew together one Block One square, one Block Two square, one Block One square, one Block Three square and one Block One square in that order from left to right to make Row One (Figure 11).
- 11. Repeat Step 10 and refer to Figure 11 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two, Row Three and Row Four.
- 12. Sew the four pieced rows, in numerical order from top to bottom and the three Block Four strips together lengthwise, alternating them from the top to the bottom, to make the 50 1/2" x 55 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 11).




Quilt Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Diagram

- Sew one 1 1/2" x 55 1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 1 1/2" x 52 1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew one 2 1/2" x 57 1/2" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 2 1/2" x 56 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 15. Sew one 4 1/2" x 61 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 4 1/2" x 64 1/2" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

Finishing:

- 16. Prepare backing using two widths with 1/2" seams. Press seams open. Trim backing to 72" x 77".
- 17. Layer quilt, batting and backing. Baste layers together.
- 18. Quilt as desired.
- 19. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
- 20. Join seven 2 1/2" H binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
- 21. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.


