## Cutting Instructions:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. Strips are cut across the width of fabric (perpendicular to selvedges) unless otherwise stated. All seams are sewn with $1 / 4$ " seam unless otherwise stated. Label all pieces.

## From Fabric A:

1. Fussy cut two $141 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 211 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, centered on the large blocks. (Blocks)
2. Fussy cut two 10 1/2" squares, centered on the owls. (Blocks)

## From Fabric B:

1. Cut two 2 1/2" strips; sub-cut four 2 1/2" x 17 1/2" strips. (Blocks)
2. Cut four 2" strips. (Border)
3. Cut four 2" x $211 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. (Blocks)
4. Cut eight $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. (Binding)

From Fabric C:

1. Cut four $33 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2$ " strips. (Blocks)
2. Cut four $15 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 22$ 1/4" strips. (Blocks)

## From Fabric D:

1. Cut four 2" $\times 263 / 4$ " strips. (Blocks)
2. Cut four 2" x 25 1/4" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric E:

1. Cut four 2" strips. (Border)
2. Cut two 2" strips; sub-cut four 2" x $131 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. (Blocks)
3. Cut one 2" strip; sub-cut four 2" x 10 1/2" strips. (Blocks)

## From Fabric F:

1. Cut one 12 1/2" strip; sub-cut four 12 1/2" x $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ strips. (Blocks)
2. Cut four $75 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 22$ 1/4" strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric G:

1. Cut four 2" $\times 263 / 4$ " strips. (Blocks)
2. Cut four 2" $\times 251 / 4$ " strips. (Blocks)

From Fabric H :

1. Cut one 3 1/2" strip; sub-cut four 3 1/2" squares. (Border)

## From Fabric I:

1. Cut four 2" strips. (Border)
2. Cut four $11 / 2$ " strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 65$ " strips. (Border)
3. Cut three $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 58$ " strips. (Border)

## From Fabric J:

1. Cut two $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 67$ " length of fabric (LOF) strips. (Border)
2. From the remaining fabric, cut two $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68$ " WOF strips, piece as needed. (Border)

## Piecing Instructions:

The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations while assembling the various components.

1. Sew one 2" $\times 211 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to each side of one $141 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 211 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle. Sew one $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make one Unit 1 rectangle (Figure 1). Trim the unit to measure 16 1/2" x 24 1/2". Repeat to make a second Unit 1 rectangle.

2. Sew one $33 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 241 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to each side of one Unit 1 rectangle. Sew one $15 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 22$ 1/4" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make one Unit 2 rectangle (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 2 rectangle.

3. Sew one 2" $\times 263 / 4$ " Fabric $D$ strip to each side of one Unit 2 rectangle. Sew one 2" x 25 1/4" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make one $251 / 4$ " $\times 293 / 4$ " Block One rectangle (Figure 3). Repeat to make a second Block One rectangle.

4. Sew one 2" x 10 1/2" Fabric E strip to each side of one 10 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew one 2" x 13 1/2" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make one Unit 3 square (Figure 4). Trim the block to measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" square. Repeat to make a second Unit 3 square.

## Make 2 units

5. Sew one $53 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F strip to each side of one Unit 3 square. Sew one $75 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 22$ 1/4" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 3 square to make one Unit 4 rectangle (Figure 5). Repeat to make a second Unit 4 rectangle.

Make 2 units
6. Sew one 2 " $\times 263 / 4$ " Fabric $G$ strip to each side of one Unit 4 rectangle. Sew one 2" x 25 1/4" Fabric $G$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 rectangle to make one $251 / 4$ " x 29 3/4" Block Two rectangle (Figure 6). Repeat to make a second Block Two rectangle.

Make 2 blocks
7. Sew one Block One rectangle to the left side of one Block Two rectangle lengthwise to make the top row. Sew one Block Two rectangle to the left side of one Block One rectangle lengthwise to make the bottom row. Sew together the two rows to make the 50" x 59" Center Block (Figure 7).

8. Sew together one 2" x WOF Fabric E strip, one 2 " x WOF Fabric B strip and one 2" x WOF Fabric I strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make one Strip Set 1 (Figure 8). Repeat to make four Strip Set 1's total.
9. Cut the four Strip Set 1 's into forty-eight 5 " $\times 3$ 1/2" Unit 5 strips (Figure 9).

Cut 48 units
10. Sew together thirteen Unit 5 strips as shown to make the Left Side Border (Figure 10).
11. Sew together thirteen Unit 5 strips as shown to make the Right Side Border (Figure 11).

12. Sew together eleven Unit 4 strips end to end. Sew one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Figure 12).

13. Sew together eleven Unit 4 strips end to end. Sew one 3 1/2" Fabric H square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Figure 13).

## Quilt Assembly: Refer to the Quilt Diagram

14. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
15. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Sew one $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 65$ " Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one $11 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 58$ " Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Sew one $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 67^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 68$ " Fabric $J$ strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

## Finishing:

18. Prepare backing using two widths with $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ seams. Press seams open. Trim backing to $76 " \times 85$ ".
19. Layer quilt, batting and backing. Baste layers together.
20. Quilt as desired.
21. Trim layers even with quilt top squaring corners.
22. Join eight $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} B$ binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Attach binding using your favorite method.
23. Make a label and sew to the back of the quilt.
