



## Using Calm Classroom to Improve School Behavior in Chicago Public Schools\*

### Year 1 Behavioral Data Scores Interim Report K-8<sup>th</sup> Grade

Calm Classroom is currently the program of focus in the second year of a 3 year Department of Education i3 research grant. The principal investigator is the Erikson Institute and the lead researcher is Chapin Hall at the University of Chicago. The study is entitled, Calm Classroom K-2: Mindfulness and other Replenishment Practices to Improve Young Children's Stress Levels, Self-Regulation, and Productive Engagement in School.

The randomized control study is one of the largest studies on mindfulness in schools in the United States. It is measuring results on 12,000 Chicago Public School students in 32 Chicago Public Schools. The results are being measured across kindergarten through 8th grade with a special emphasis on K-2nd grade. Program launch was September 2015. K-2 initial results are expected from Chapin Hall in late 2017

### Year one school wide K-8<sup>th</sup> behavioral data interim report

#### **Calm Classroom:**

To estimate the improvement (if any) in school behavioral outcomes after receiving Calm Classroom (CC), we examined school-wide Chicago Public School's (CPS) behavioral records for changes in all 3<sup>rd</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students at six CPS K-8<sup>th</sup> grade neighborhood public schools. These schools had been selected for research by the University of Chicago's Chapin Hall (CH) as part of a DOE i3 three year randomized control research study entitled Mindfulness and other Replenishment Practices to Improve Young Children's Stress Levels, Self-Regulation, and Productive Engagement in School (CCK2). The results are being measured across kindergarten through 8th grade with a special emphasis and additional student level measurements and interventions on K-2nd grade. Research project launch was September 2015.

### **Calm Classroom Test Schools (CC – Test)**

For this analysis, we selected six test schools (CC-Test) based on receiving Calm Classroom Training during school year 2015-2016 of the CCK2 Study (cohort 1) on Calm Classroom that had been matched by academic standing, income and racial demographics.

### **Control Group 1 (CA-1)**

Nine control schools (CA-1) were selected based on receiving Calm Classroom Training during year two of the CCK2 Study (cohort2) on Calm Classroom and not having any existing social and emotional learning programs in place during 2014-2015 and 2015-2016. These nine schools did receive calm classroom training as part of the CCK2 study in the 2016-2017 school year. The control schools (cohort2) were matched by the same academic standing, income and racial demographics as the cohort 1 test schools.

This resulted in a sample of school-wide behavioral data for the six test schools (CC-Test) with approximately 2,400 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students and nine control schools (CA-1) with approximately 4,800 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Starting 2014 (CC-Test) pre-test behavioral misconducts per 100 student's scores were also closely matched between the cohort 1 test group and cohort 2 control group CA-1.

During this time frame (2014-2015 vs. 2015-2016):

- The (CC-Test) pre-test behavioral misconducts per 100 student's scores (12.50 vs 9.70) declined approximately -23% while the control group only (CA-1) declined by -2.4% (11.91 vs.11.63).

### **Control Group 2 (CB-2)**

In addition we reviewed data on matched K-8<sup>th</sup> grade schools across the entire CPS district. This control group of 148 K-8<sup>th</sup> grade schools (CB-2) out of the 664 district wide CPS schools was matched based on the following criteria that closely matched to the CC-Test schools (cohort 1): Schools were eliminated if they:

- Participated in the CCK2 (Calm Classroom K-2 and 3rd-8th grade) i3 study schools (16 schools)
- CPS schools that had been independently trained in Calm Classroom since fall of 2008
- High Schools, Charter schools standalone middle schools, military schools, specialized Schools (Montessori, alternative, special education. Options schools)
- Schools with less than 70% of students on free or reduced lunch which matches the range of the test group.
- School with less than 85% total of African American or Hispanic students which matches the test group.
- Schools with 20th day enrollment less than 260 students and more than 800 students which matches the test group.
- Schools with incomplete behavior data during school year 2014-2015 and 2015-2016.

This resulted in a sample of school-wide behavioral data for the original six test schools (CA-1) with approximately 2,400 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students and 148 control schools (CB-2) with approximately 68,000 3<sup>rd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade students.

### **Summary Reflections and Conclusions**

Whereas the smaller nine school control group (CA-1) definitively had no operational social and emotional learning programs in operation during 2014-2015 or 2015-2016. We were unable to ascertain

if the larger control group of 148 schools (CB-2) did or did not have any SEL programming during 2014-2015 or 2015 - 2016 which may have impacted the scores for decreases or increases in behavioral changes.

Starting 2014 (CC-Test) pre-test behavioral misconducts per 100 student's scores were also closely matched between the cohort 1 test group and the district wide matched control group (CB-2).

During time frame (2014-2015 vs. 2015-2016):

- The CC-Test groups' pre-test behavioral misconducts per 100 student's scores (12.50 vs 9.70) declined approximately -23% while the district wide matched control group (CB-2) increased 21.0% (12.61 vs.15.19).

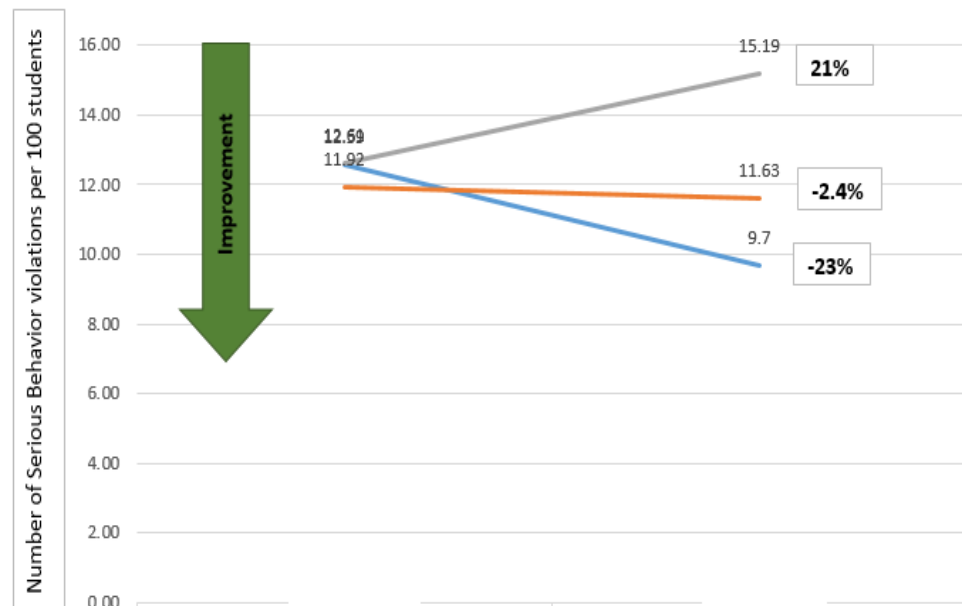
Because of limited sample size (six schools) of the CC-Test group neither the CA-1 or CA-2 control group's pre nor post-test comparisons to the six (CC-Test) school test group serves as a definitive proof that Calm Classroom makes a statistically significant impact on scores for serious offenses of behavior violations.

**However, the significant results demonstrated a substantive improvement in behavioral scores both independently and relative to both control groups.**
