A1 – Nickname for the composer Vivaldi, also the name of an ensemble fronted by Piers Adams.

A2 – Recently retired American recorder maker, whose first name is Thomas.

A3 – First name of Brüggem (1934-2014), the pioneering contemporary recorder player.

A4 – Surname of the composer of *Suite for Recorder & Strings* (1957) and first name of the composer of *Der Fluyten Lust-Hof* (1644).

A5 – First name of 20th century recorder player, who, together with father Arnold, was a keystone in the recorder's revival.

A6 – A tree, Mediterranean in origin, whose wood is commonly used for recorders.

A7 – City in The Netherlands where a famous 14th century recorder was discovered in 1940. This instrument is commonly described as “The ___ Recorder”.

D1 – Location of The Early Music Shop's showroom in Suffolk, also the home of the music festival founded by Benjamin Britten.

D2 – Beatle who played the recorder on the 1967 song *The Fool on the Hill*.

D3 – Dutch recorder player who will be performing a headline concert at the London International Festival of Early Music in November 2023.

D4 – Surname of Danish recorder player Michala, one of the most prolific recorder players of recent generations.

D5 – *The Orange Tree* ____, the title of the 2023 album by The Royal Wind Music (previously The Early Music Shop's featured album in May 2023).

D6 – Prefix of –bass which describes a recorder in C which is one octave lower than a great bass.

D7 – Name for a recorder one octave lower than a soprano.
