It started in 2012 when Trisha Haulihan, a volunteer at a local county animal control shelter saw how many German Shepherds were being listed for euthanasia. Seeing how little resources are available for rescuing this specific breed, she went to work creating a safe haven for them.

Without the belief that behavioral, medical or age should be a factor when it comes to taking in dogs that have been surrendered from their owner, abused or left in pounds, they rescue those that others might turn away from. With the help of Pet Food Depot over the years they've been able to help grant these pups wishes.

Each ornament has a German Shephard's name and Christmas wish. The last three years Pet Food Depot has had extraordinary success emptying the ornaments and they're hoping to do the same this year.
