DAY I



MORNING

Start your day as early as 7-8 am to beat the crowd to the Philae Temple. Dedicated to Isis, and located on an island, it was once submerged by the Nile waters and has been relocated by UNESCO. Philae is one of our favourite temples because of its spectacular location and the architectural wealth with monuments of various eras, extending from the Pharaohs to the Caesars.

If you are feeling sporty, take a kayak from the lake and make your way to the Temple where you can disembark. The lake is magnificent with impressive boulders jetting out of the water and surrounded by golden sand dunes. You will pass by ancient ruins and then Philae appears in the horizon becoming impossibly grand as you get closer.

Recommended Tip: Ask for a Pylon Panorama ticket, for an additional cost, to climb to one of the pylons and get an amazing panoramic view of the temple and the Nile. Only you and a few people might be up there, since it's a well kept secret.

LUNCH

Across the temple of Philae is **Eco Nubia**, a lovely ecolodge serving the most delicious lunch and the best views of the temple.

AFTERNOON

Your next destination of the day is the Unfinished Obelisk. As its name indicates, this obelisk, if completed, would have been the tallest in the world at 42 metres (137 ft.) high. A magnificent proof of ancient workmanship, the Obelisk was never finished because the stone cracked.


Recommended Tip: On your way to the exit, make sure not to miss the small line of shops, where you will find the only tourist bookstore in Aswan. Owned and operated by a Nubian family, the well-stocked Obelisk bookstore carries an impressive collection of books about Egyptian and Nubian history, culture, and literature in different languages, as well as vintage B&W photos. EVENING

Take a Felucca ride to Elephantine Island, where you can visit the colourful Nubian villages there and get to know the people and their ways of life. The island is also home to Aswan's hidden gem Animalia museum, a large family-owned house dedicated to the history, traditions, customs, language, flora and fauna of Nubia. The owner. DAY II



MORNING

Start your day as early as possible to beat the heat and take a Felucca ride to two gems off the beaten track in Aswan: Aga Khan Mausoleum and the Monastery of St. Simeon. The mausoleum is a tomb of the Nizari Ismaili leader Sir Sultan Muhammad Shah, Aga Khan III who was recommended to travel to Aswan to treat his one-leg paralysis in the sands of the golden land.

Next, you can take a camel ride or walk to the monastery to learn about Coptic Christianity's history. On the same island and sand dunes are the Tombs of the Nobles, carved up to 18 metres deep in the

mountain where different Ancient governors are buried. The walk down the sand dunes will be enjoyable with an unbeatable view of Aswan's mainland and the Nile - but only if you wear comfy shoes and have your water bottle, hat and scarf to protect you from the heat and sand.

LUNCH

Take a short Felucca ride back to the mainland for delicious yet unfussy and tasty food at Chef Khalil restaurant, located close to Aswan train station. This small and popular restaurant serves a good variety of fresh fish from Lake Nasser and the Red Sea.

AFTERNOON

If interested to learn more about ancient and modern Nubian culture and history, head to the mainland to visit the Nubian Museum, dedicated fully to Nubian civilization and people. If you did not get the chance to visit the Obelisk Bookstore, make sure to pass by their newest branch inside the museum.

Next, visit Aswan's famous Souq where you can buy souvenirs ranging from Aswan's famous sunbaked peanuts, henna powder, spices to perfumes, dried hibiscus, clothes and customized Ancient Egyptian accessories. You will also find handmade artifacts such as carpets, baskets and hats.

EVENING

Take a Felucca ride to the west of Suheil Island where you can see more Nubian villages and beautifully coloured houses. Shop local arts and crafts and buy fragrant spices there. When in Nubia, you definitely do not want to miss a dinner and party at Anakato Nubian House.
