2023 and Beyond - A note from the Board

Vintage Wings of Canada operations continue to be in a period of transition. As you may be aware, the VWC aircraft collection includes those aircraft owned directly by the charitable foundation, the Michael U. Potter aircraft, owned by Mike Potter, and a number of other aircraft owned by individuals associated with the foundation. The associated aircraft collection is growing, with some very interesting additions, that we will see in the coming months.

With respect to the hangar at Gatineau, the major change is we will no longer be offering ad-hoc tours of the aircraft collection housed there. The hangar will not be opened to the public on Saturdays, like it has been in the past.

Mike Potter continues to be extremely supportive of Vintage Wings and wants his fighter collection to be accessible and seen. Tours of the Gatineau hangar going forward will be by prior arrangement, and generally focused on groups with a significant aviation interest.

VWC will continue to have aircraft based in the Gatineau and will carry out events from the hanger. Aircraft maintenance and much of our flight training actives will be carried out elsewhere. We will also be carrying out some of our fly days and other events from other locations, including Rockcliffe Airport and Arnprior Airport.

LYSANDER WINS FIVE AWARDS AT EAA – AIRVENTURE

Crowds surrounded the rare, unique 1942 Canadian-built Westland Lysander at Oshkosh this year. Being the only one flying in North America, and powered by the only Bristol Mercury XX engine operating in N. A., most spectators had never seen one before. The most frequent question directed to the Vintage Wings of Canada support crew was, "What is it?"

The Warbird Judge team certainly appreciated the aircraft, presenting it with the Phoenix Award (and Silver Wrench), Best Liaison Aircraft (and Silver Wrench), plus Judge's Appreciation. This was an outstanding and remarkable recognition of the quality of the aircraft's restoration, and the effort made to keep it in airworthy condition.

During the Warbirds In Review session, the stands were packed as people listened to pilot Dave Hadfield talk about the history of the type – landing by moonlight in Occupied France to drop off and pick up spies – and the quirks and capabilities of flying the unusual STOL aircraft. https://youtu.be/z5YP35HavbE

This Lysander was built in 1942 at Malton airport (Toronto) in the same facility that later built the Avro Arrow. Serving in Canada during WWII, it functioned as a Gunnery-Trainer, towing a target-drogue on a long line. After the war it was preserved by pilot-collector-farmer Harry Whereatt of Assiniboia Saskatchewan. Its restoration was completed by Mike Potter and the Vintage Wings of Canada team at Gatineau Quebec, and it flew in 2010. Later, in 2019, the aeroplane was purchased by ex-RCAF officer John Carswell of Toronto (of Lysander Fund and Canso Fund investments) and it now flies under the banner of Lysander Historical Aviation. The maintenance crew is Vintech Aero, of Gatineau, where the aircraft is based.


The 800 nm (each-way) journey was accomplished with 4 fuel stops to replenish the 95 imperial gallon fuel tank. There were no support aircraft alongside, and no Engineer in the back seat – which speaks very well of the tough old bird. The extremely rare Bristol Mercury XX supercharged and geared 850 hp engine burns about 40 imp/gal/hr – and more than a few quarts of oil.

Pilot Dave Hadfield is a 28,000-hour retired Air Canada Captain, owner of vintage aircraft, and Chief Pilot for Vintage Wings of Canada, as well as Lysander Historical Aviation. His wife Robin is President of the Ninety-Nines. The Hadfield family includes 8 licensed pilots including (ret'd) Astronaut Chris Hadfield.
