How to make a coral sculpture

Using basic materials found at home - newspaper, masking tape, and paints create your own coral sculpture.







Materials

- Newspaper
- Masking tape
- · Empty tape roll
- · Bits of bubble wrap
- Scissors
- · Cardboard toilet roll
- Paints
- · Brushes.

Instructions

Step 1. Have an empty tape roll ready to use as your base. Use two layers of newspaper sheets together and roll into a long sausage length.

Step 2. Scrunch and twist the newspaper into a curved coral tentacle. Tape the edge to the inside of the empty tape roll.

Step 3. Add another 3 or 4 tentacles, using the same method, roll and scrunch newspaper and tape to the inside of the roll.

Step 4. Cut a toilet roll tube in half to slot inside your base. This is for extra support and will allow you to add minitentacles inside.

Step 5. Stuff newspaper balls to fill in any gaps on the inside so your tentacles are snug and supported.

Step 6. Masking tape any other wobbly areas to give it more strength and twist the tentacles as you go.

Step 7. Add small bits of bubble wrap to add texture to your tentacles.

Step 8. Choose bright colours to paint your coral, add spots or stars to bring it to life.
