# Top tip 1:

I carry out the repetitive aspects of the work, (like cutting the shapes, piercing them work and threading them) in all the small bits of time when I am waiting for the kettle to boil, or for a visitor, or any other spare time I have. But this could also be done while chatting or listening to music.

### Top tip 2:

Use a bradawl to pierce the shapes its quick and easy

## Top tip 3:

Collect a lot before you start & keep collecting anything in-teresting as you go along - always keep your eyes open for interesting things: I once spotted that children had left some bubble blowing plas-tic shapes at our local railway station and I put them in my pocket for my work!
