Autumn Leaf Repeat Printing with Plasticine Sketch

Create beautiful leaf prints with simple materials, suitable for a kitchen table workspace



Materials

- · Plasticine/Modelling Clay or Blue Tack
- Ink pads, or a little bit of whatever ink or paint you have at home
- · Biro or sharp pencil
- · Selection of coloured paper









Instructions

Step 1. Cut off a small piece of plasticine - about a thumb size.

Step 2. Roll the plasticine into a ball shape with your hands to smooth edges. Then roll it into a wide sausage shape.

Step 3. Flatten one end of the plasticine by pressing onto the table to squish it down.

Step 4. Using a sharp pencil or biro draw a leaf shape into the plasticine. See how the biro indents into the plasticine. Draw the outlines and details of your leaf but keep it simple at first.

Step 5. Press the biro into the outer edges of your design so that your drawing pops out like a stamp. Smooth with your fingers or just using the biro point.

Step 6. Your plasticine stamp should be raised up ready to pick up ink.

Step 7. Press gently into the ink pad - try patting it lightly at first to see how much ink sits on the plasticine stamp. You should see your design start to come to life in colour!

Step 8. Turn your plasticine stamp over onto the paper you have and press it down to print your designs! Repeat the inking and stamping process - be gentle with pressing the plasticine as you re-ink.

Step 9. After a few runs of stamping your plasticine stamp will start to smooth over as it's made of very soft material, so at this stage you can re-draw your design by going over your lines and then keep inking up!

Step 10. Fancy a change? You can re-use the plasticine stamp by smoothing over the design and rolling back into a sausage shape.

Step 11. After rolling into a sausage shape remember to flatten one end by squishing down onto the table.

Step 12. Draw out a new design just like in steps 4-6 and then ink up with a new coloured ink pad if you have one! See how easy it is to design repeat patterns and make cards or decorate notebooks.
