
Exploration drawings

Artwork type:

Current exploration drawings. looking at the notion of 'Looking through' This started whilst trimming a garden hedge and the various layers of activity, not only of seasonal growth. This was compounded while do the drawings, being visited by insects, birds and a grazing horse.

Dimensions:

Varied sizes A3, A2.

Medium:

Drawing charcoal, conte crayon. Equivalent: use anything to hand, pencils felt pens, use your imagination, on backs of envelopes, circulars stick them together to make interesting sheets.

Art work concept:

Drawing to discover, looking to find the unusual. Although art work can be produced anywhere, indoors or outdoors.

Top tip 1:

Aim to make a trace of what you see, not a complete drawing, discover by looking inventively.

Top tip 2:

Look for unusual relationships, try different views points and places to draw from, e.g. draw through the legs of a chair while sitting on the floor.

Top tip 3:

Vary the mark you make and what you make them with, vary the speeds, pressures and even the hand you draw them with.
