Course Description:

This course provides teachers and administrators with a persuasive and effective strategy for conferencing with uncooperative or difficult parents. This 7-step interview will move parents from being part of the problem to being committed participants in the solution.

Course Objectives: By the end of the course, participants will:

- To investigate a technique designed to improve teacher/parent interaction.
- To perform the skill and develop mastery of the technique.
- To adopt Safety, Order, and Rights[™], and utilize it as a fundamental tool for teacher/parent interaction.

- Rehearse the skills and report on the results.
- Complete written self-reflection exercises.
- Collaborate with peers using the online forum.
