Take Apart Guide for the HTC 6800 Phone

Step 1:

Tools required are:

- Safe Open Pry tools
- T6 Screwdriver
- Small Phillips Screwdriver
- Pair of Tweezers



Remove the back cover, battery, and sim card from the phone

Step 2:



Remove the 4 screws as shown in the picture above using the T6 screwdriver.

Step 3:



Use a safe open pry tool and run it along all edges to release all clips. Once the clips have been released you can remove the back from the phone.

Step 4:



Using a small Phillips screwdriver remove the 2 screws shown in the picture above.

Step 5:



Carefully lift the motherboard. The motherboard will still be connected to the phone by ribbon cables as shown in the picture above. Use a safe open pry tool to release the ribbon pop connections. You can now remove the motherboard.

Step 6:



Remove the 4 small Phillips screws as shown in the picture above. You can then remove the black plastic layer from the phone.

Step 7:



Run the safe pry tool along all edges of the phone to release the clips. Then remove this layer from the phone.

Step 8:



Remove the three small Philips screws as shown in the picture above.

Step 9:



Peel back the tape from the back of the lcd screen. This will reveal a jaw clip as shown in the picture above. Lift the jaw with a safe open pry tool. You can then remove the cable with a pair of tweezers. You also need to pop the ribbon cable connector at the bottom of the phone. You can then remove the rest of the tape.

Step 10:



Once the tape has been removed you can remove the damaged lcd screen ready to replace with the new part. To put the phone back together reverse these instructions.
