## HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE


- Before proceeding, use a ruler to confirm the printed paper size in the box beneath.
- Pull tightly. The sizer must fit snugly to produce an accurate size.
- Measure your finger at the time of the day when it will be at its largest—this is usually at the end of the day.
- Avoid measuring your fingers when they are cold or damp, as they will be at their smallest.



Measure the bar at right to make sure your print out is correctly sized. If the bar does not measure exactly 3 inches, check that page scaling is set to “none” on your print dialog box, and that you are printing at full size.


## CREATE YOUR OWN RING SIZER

1. Cut out the ring sizer below.
2. Wrap the ring sizer snugly around the widest part of the intended finger so that the numbers are visible to you, and insert the pointed end through the slit you made in the sizer.
3. Make note of the number that lines up with the slit, this is your ring size! Keep in mind that quarter sizes are also available if your sizer indicates that you are between whole and half sizes.




## MEASURE A CURRENT RING

1. Choose a ring that correctly fits the finger you are purchasing the ring for. In the United States the engagement ring and wedding band are most commonly worn on the “ring finger” of the left hand.
2. Lay the ring over each of the size circles below, until you are able to closely match the inside edge of the ring to one of the circles on the guide.
3. If the ring falls between two of the sizes, order the quarter size in the middle.



## THE STRING TEST

1. Cut a small piece of string, thread or ribbon from a spool.
2. MEASURE: Wrap it snugly around your finger for an accurate measurement.
3. DETERMINE: Compare your measurement with our sizing chart.
4. CHECK: Double check for accuracy.

#### THE MEASUREMENT

1. Using a string, ribbon, or measurement tape, measure the circumference of your wrist just above the wrist bone (toward the elbow).
2. Make a note of the number at the point where the measuring tape meets the o.
3. Compare your measurement to the chart below, and choose the corresponding bracelet size.

If your bracelet appears to be between two sizes, we suggest you choose the larger size.


