Introduction


Purpose:

The purpose of this paper is to quantify and describe the pool of labor currently available to Johnson County employers.

Laborshed:

In this study, the Johnson County laborshed was defined as the area within approximately a one-hour commute from Johnson County. The region is shown on the map below and includes the following 20 counties: Bates, Cass, Clay, Jackson, Johnson, Lafayette, Platte and Ray in Missouri; and Anderson, Atchison, Douglas, Franklin, Jefferson, Johnson, Leavenworth, Linn, Miami, Osage, Shawnee and Wyandotte in Kansas.

Data and Methodology:

The data presented in this report were extracted from current labor reports generated by the Kansas Department of Labor, the Missouri Department of Economic Development and U.S. Census Bureau. In some instances current data were unavailable. The Labor Commuting Patterns were modeled using he Local Employment Dynamics data from the U.S. Census Bureau. Mode of Work Trip data were estimated applying the U.S. Census Bureau's 2010 American Community Survey 1-,3- or 5-Year Estimates to 2011 labor figures. Occupations and Industries were estimated by applying 2000 census figures to 2011 labor figures, and Educational Attainment data were taken directly form the U.S. Census Bureau's 2010 American Community Survey 1-, 3- or 5-Year Estimates.

Format:

The report discusses general statistics, commuting patterns, occupations and industry of labor force. Information is presented in tables that provide estimates of current labor force characteristics. Corresponding maps are included when appropriate. An overall summary of the characteristics of the Johnson County laborshed is presented on the following pages.

SUMMARY

General Characteristics:

- In 2011, there were approximately 1.25 million workers residing in the 20-county laborshed.
- Johnson County's labor force of 301,113 accounted for 24.0% of the laborshed's total.
- On average during 2011, there were approximately 99,146 residents of the laborshed that were unemployed and looking for jobs. This calculates to an approximate unemployment rate of 7.9%.

Commuting Patterns:

- In 2011, an estimated 146,166 workers commuted to jobs in Johnson County from other counties, and 104,716 Johnson County residents left the county each day to work, making the county a net importer of approximately 41,450 workers.
- In 2011, 55.0% of all workers in Johnson County resided in Johnson County.
- Approximately 64.2% of Johnson County's resident labor force, 178,507 persons, worked for Johnson County employers during 2011, and 104,716 workers (37.0%) commuted outside the county.

Occupations of the Laborshed's Work Force:

- Approximately 170,932 laborshed workers were in management, business and related occupations.
- Professional and related occupations made up 26.5% of the Johnson County labor force. Johnson County had the largest concentration of workers in these occupations with 30.9% of the region's total.
- With 157,972 members, service occupations constituted 13.7% of the laborshed during 2011. The largest number of these workers resided in Jackson County.
- Sales and related occupations consisted of 133,363 (11.6%) of the total laborshed.
- An estimated 195,365 persons, 16.9% of the laborshed's total, were in office and administrative support occupations during 2011. This is the second largest occupational category in the laborshed.
- In 2011, approximately 79,081 (6.9%) persons residing in the laborshed were in production occupations.
- A total of 105,397 workers were employed in construction, extraction and maintenance occupations.
- In 2011, approximately 66,457 (5.8%) persons residing in the laborshed were in transportation and material moving occupations.

Industry of Laborshed Workers:

- Firms in the construction industry employed 79,219 workers, 6.9% of the laborshed's total, during 2011.
- There were 127,418 employees of manufacturing firms residing in the laborshed during 2011, 11.0% of the total labor force. The manufacturing industry had the third-largest concentration of laborshed jobs.
- In 2011, there were approximately 57,003 laborshed residents working for firms in the transportation and warehousing industry 4.9% of the region's total work force.
- The utilities industry employed 11,233 residents of the laborshed 1.0% of the region's total.
- The laborshed had 46,187 workers in the wholesale trade industries in 2011, 4.0% of the region's total.
- The retail trade industry employed 134,807 laborshed residents. This represented 11.7% of the total labor force and the second largest concentration of employment during 2011.
- Approximately 8.3% (95,959) of the laborshed participated in the F.I.R.E. industry.
- In 2011, the information industry employed 57,767 (5.0%) workers from the total laborshed.
- The professional, scientific, management, administrative, and waste management services industries provided jobs for 112,085 workers -9.7% of the total laborshed.
- By far, the education, health and social services industry employed the largest share of workers in the region with 224,064 (19.4%).
- With 84,695 workers from the laborshed, the arts, entertainment, recreation accommodation, and food services industries employed 7.3% of the 20-county labor force.
- The laborshed had 54,107 (4.7%) workers in the other services industries.
- The public administration industry consisted of 5.0% (57,986) of the laborshed workers.

Educational Attainment:

• Attainment of at least a Bachelor's degree was highest among residents of Johnson County (51.6%), followed by Douglas County (49.9%) and Platte County (36.5%).

Figure 2 2011 Labor Force




Figure 3 2011 Average Number of Workers Unemployed



- Johnson County's labor force of 301,113 accounted for 24.0% of the laborshed's total.
- There were 889,551 workers, 71.0% of the laborshed's total, living in Johnson County and the seven counties that touch its borders.
- On average during 2011, there were approximately 99,146 residents of the laborshed that were unemployed and looking for jobs. This calculates to an approximate unemployment rate of 7.9%.
- During the year, the average unemployment rate for Johnson County and the seven counties that touch its borders was 8.0%. This calculated to approximately 70,795 unemployed persons in these counties seeking jobs.

Residence of Johnson County Job Holders



Workplace of Johnson County Labor Force



Outside the Laborshed

- In 2011, 55.0% of all persons working in Johnson County resided in Johnson County. Johnson County employers also attracted workers from all other counties in the laborshed. The largest numbers came from Jackson County, MO (42,191) and Wyandotte County, KS (24,788).
- Approximately 64.2% of Johnson County's resident labor force, 178,507 persons, worked for Johnson County employers during 2011. The remaining 104,716 members of Johnson County's labor force (37.0%) commuted to jobs outside the county.
- Jackson County, MO attracted the largest number of Johnson County's commuters (43,592) followed by Wyandotte County (19,359). The third largest group of Johnson County commuters traveled to jobs in Clay County, MO.

Automobile Work Trip (Alone and Carpools)



Public Transportation Work Trip



- With almost 91.8% of the laborshed workers commuting by automobile, it was the overwhelming choice of transportation in 2011. The majority (82.8%) made the trip alone.
- In 2011, it is estimated that 9.0% of the laborshed's workers carpooled and 1.2% took some form of public transportation.
- By far, Jackson County, MO had the largest number of public transportation users with 8,294, 59.1% of the total workers traveling by public transportation.
- In Johnson County, 85.9% of the workers drove alone, 7.0% carpooled and 0.4% used public transportation.

Figure 8 Other Transportation




Figure 9 Walked or Worked at Home



Figure 10 Management, Business & Related Occupations




Figure 11 Professional & Related Occupations



- Professional and related occupations made up 26.5% of the Johnson County labor force. Johnson County had the largest concentration of workers in these occupations with 30.9% of the region's total.

Figure 12 Service Occupations




Figure 13 Sales & Related Occupations



- With 157,972 members, service occupations constituted 13.7% of the laborshed during 2011. The largest number of these workers resided in Jackson County.
- Johnson County's share of the total workers in the service occupations was 17.9%, second to Jackson County's share of 29.3%.
- Sales and related occupations consisted of 133,363 (11.6%) of the total laborshed.
- Sales and related occupations constituted 14.9% of Johnson County's labor force, with 42,059 (31.5%) of the laborshed's workers.

Figure 14 Office & Administrative Support Occupations




Figure 15 Production Occupations



- It is estimated that 195,365 persons, 16.9% of the laborshed's total, were in office and administrative support occupations during 2011. This is the second largest share of the total labor force within the laborshed.
- Johnson County had 14.7% of the county labor force participating in office and administrative jobs. This constituted 21.3% of the total laborshed. Jackson County had the largest share of workers from the laborshed in these occupations with 28.5%.
- In 2011, approximately 79,081 (6.9%) persons residing in the laborshed were in production occupations.
- Jackson County had the largest share (28.6%) of the laborshed workers in production occupations, followed by Johnson County with 13.3%.

Figure 16 Farming, Forestry & Fishing Occupations



Construction, Extraction & Maintenance Occupations



Transportation & Material Moving Occupations



Figure 19 Labor Force Working in Agriculture Industry




Figure 20 Labor Force Working in Mining Industry



Figure 21 Labor Force Working in Construction Industry




Figure 22 Labor Force Working in Manufacturing Industry



Labor Force Working in Transportation & Warehousing Industry




Figure 24 Labor Force Working in Utilities Industry



Figure 25 Labor Force Working in Wholesale Trade Industry




Figure 26 Labor Force Working in Retail Trade Industry



Figure 27 Labor Force Working in F.I.R.E Industry




Figure 28 Labor Force Working in Information Industry



Administrative & Waste Management Services Industry




Figure 30 Labor Force Working in Educational, Health & Social Services Industry



Accommodation & Food Services Industry



Labor Force Working in Other Services (except Public Administration) Industry



Figure 33 Labor Force Working in Public Administration Industry



Figure 34 % of Population 25+ with at Least a High School Diploma




Figure 35 % of Population 25+ with at Least a Bachelor's Degree



- Attainment of at least a Bachelor's degree was highest among residents of Johnson County (51.6%), followed by Douglas County (49.9%) and Platte County (36.5%).
- Approximately 21.7% of Douglas County residents over 25 held graduate or professional degrees in 2010, followed by Johnson County (18.5%) and Leavenworth County (13.3%).
- Johnson County residents are highly educated. In 2010, Johnson County had the highest percent of high school graduates (95.5%) and college graduates (51.6%) among the counties in the 20-county laborshed.
