The Juxtaposed: Religion shelf by San Francisco design duo Mike and Maaike was specially formed to hold only seven books: the basic texts for the world's most popular religions, nestled into custom-milled slots in a 3-foot-long, rather monastic-looking span of reclaimed barn timber. The book row's resulting flat top is meant to suggest that all major faiths should be considered equal. "It's sculpture, a gallery object," McQuaid argued. "There's humor to it, but it's a one-liner." The jury nonetheless couldn't resist keeping the \$2,500 piece in the prize-winning pile. "In spite of its flaws, I absolutely love it," Dunnigan said.
