

Pom Pom Tea Towel Drape

easy/beginner

SUPPLIES

- 2 - 1/4 yard cuts of fabric (9 x 44")
- 1/4 yard of pom pom trim
- thread, matching trim
- fabric tack glue of choice

INSTRUCTIONS

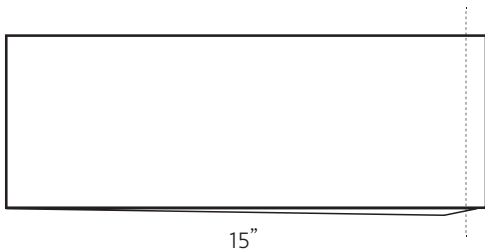
1. Fold the quarter yard cuts in half



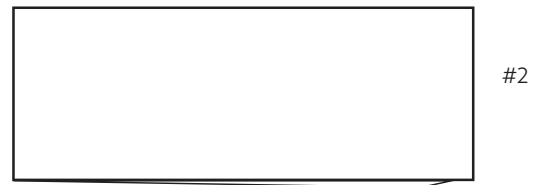
2. Trim width to 8.5"



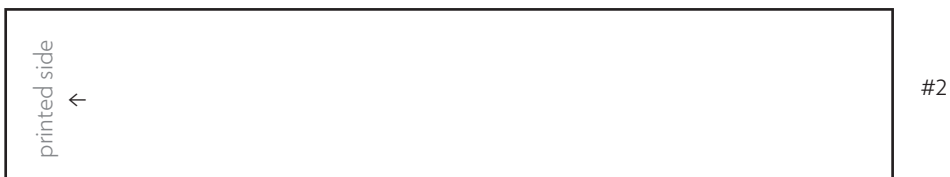
3. Trim the non-folded edge to 15"
(the drape can be made longer/shorter if desired)



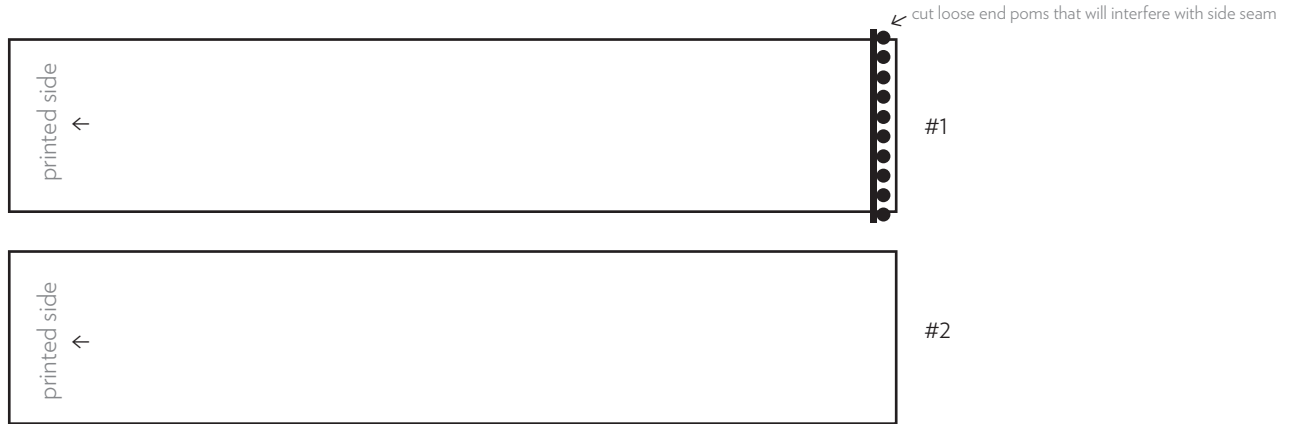
4. Repeat with the second 1/4 quarter yard cut



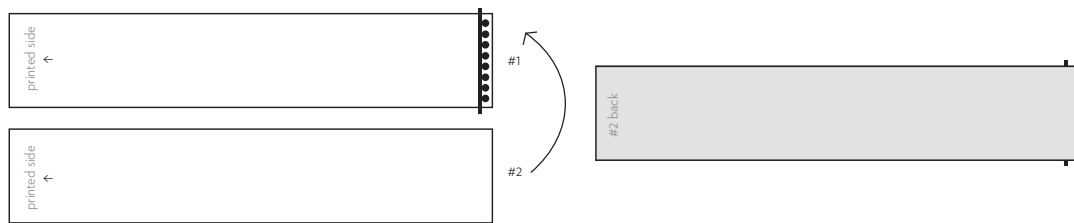
5. Unfold both cuts; if fabric is directional, align facing the same direction.



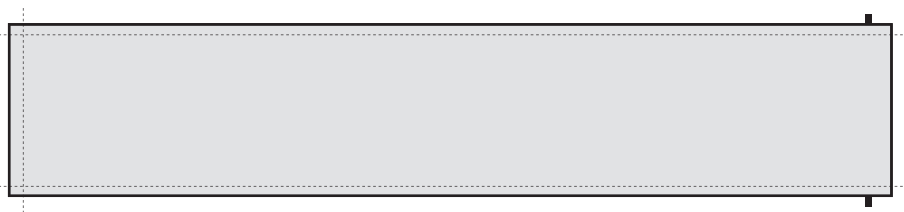
6. Lay pom pom trim 1/2" high on the bottom of cut #1. Once aligned, apply a small amount of tack glue and gently pat down trim. This will secure the trim and prevent movement while sewing.



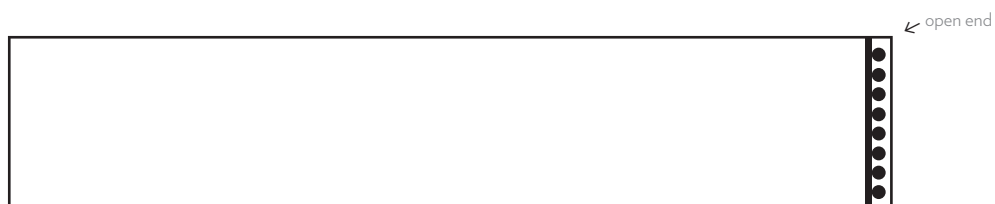
7. Flip #2 fabric cut to lay on top of #1 fabric cut; face printed sides inward.



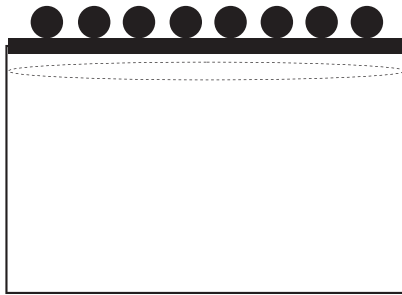
8. Sew a 1/4" seam along the top and both sides.



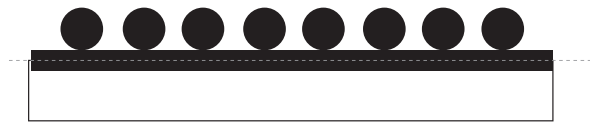
9. Use open end to turn right side out.



10. Tuck your open end inside and pin/clip. It's helpful to gently iron the tucked seam to lesson the chance of movement while sewing.



11. Sew a straight seam along the pom pom trim.



11. Iron seams and hang over your stove handle or through a drawer pull to display!
