Holistic health treatments mix with spa services for the ultimate retreats right here in Manhattan.

Two spa concepts now offer city dwellers a welcome break with nontraditional facilities boasting an array of alternative therapies. Known as the “spa castle,” **Premier57**'s 39,000-square-foot facility, complete with a “sauna valley,” hydrotherapy pools, swim-up bar, healing zones and everything else imaginable, ensures that guests think they're at an amenity-laden resort rather than looking over Midtown. Exported from the East End, **Montauk Salt Cave** gets its inspiration from underground as it opens in the East Village. This new trend is an alternative treatment for conditions such as skin ailments, asthma and allergies. The walls and grounds of the caves are made of salt, which allows one to breathe in the healing agents of Himalayan salt without the hassle of Hamptons traffic.
