

These three techniques can be used to help you gage your ring size, or that of a partners without them knowing. This is not an precise measure, however, it will give you a closer idea.

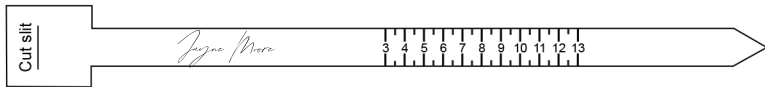


Ring Sizer

Please print at 100% scale for accuracy.

The Paper Test

- Carefully cut our the ring sizer below.
- Cut a small slit where the guideline suggests.
- Insert the pointed end through the slit you made.
- Fit the sizer snugly around the widest part of the finger you want to measure.
- The number that aligns with the slit is your proper size.



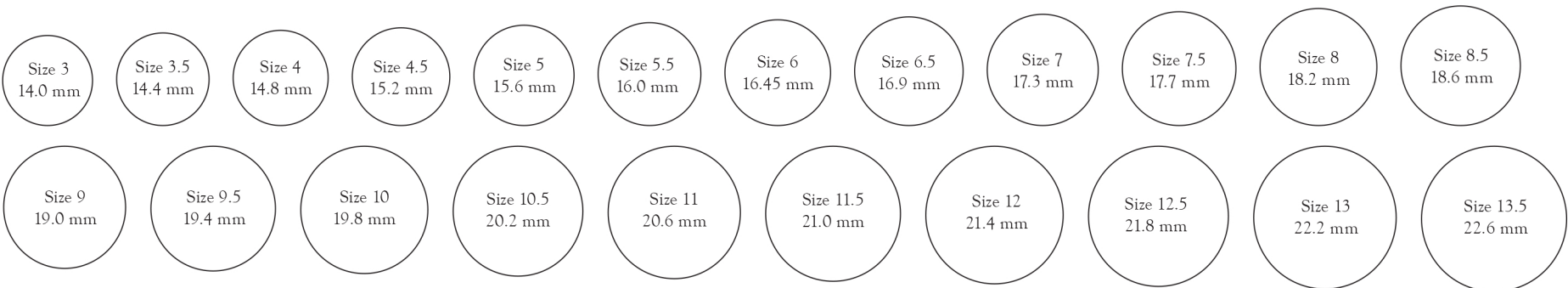
The String Test

- Cut a small piece of non-elastic string.
- Wrap it snugly around the knuckle of the finger for an acurate measurement.
- Mark with a pen.
- Compare your measurement with our sizing chart below.

The Secret Test

- Find a ring that you or your loved one currently wears on the intended finger.
- Place the ring on top of each circle until you find a perfect match.
- The match should perfectly fit along the inner edge of the ring, with the full circle clearly visible all the way around. If any of the circle is covered, check the next size down. You may be an inbetween size, ie 4.75 or 5.25.
- Double check against the rings either side for accuracy.



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
