## Fabric Requirements

Fabric A (background 1): Fat Eight Fabric B (background 2): Fat Eight

Fabric C (sashing): Fat Eight Fabric D (triangles): Fat Eight Fabric E (border): Fat Quarter

Fabric F (binding): Fat Quarter Scraps for appliqué.

Backing: 1/2 vd.

Batting: At least a 15" x 27" piece.

## Cutting Cut from the longer side of the FQ or F8

● Fabric A: Cut Three 2" x 5-1/2" rectangles. ● Fabric B: Cut Six 2-1/4" x 5-1/2" rectangles.

● Fabric C: Cut Four 1-1/2" strips, subcut two of them into Two 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles and **Two** 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles. Save 2 strips.

• Fabric D: Cut One 3" strip, subcut into Six 3" squares.

• Fabric E: Cut Four 2-3/4" strips.

• Fabric F: Cut Four 2-1/2" strips for binding.

## Assembly

1. Prepare your backing and batting with basting spray, using fusible fleece or pins.



Find and draw center lines on the batting. Place a fabric A rectangle directly in the center of the batting horizontally, right side up and pin



down. Layer a fabric B rectangle on top of it, right sides together, aligning the raw edges. Sew through all layers and press. Add another fabric B rectangle on the other side of the fabric A rectangle and press.



2. Layer the 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangle from fabric C on each side of the step 1 unit, right sides together, aligning raw edges. Sew through all layers and press. Now layer two fabric B units on top of the fabric C units. sew and press. Follow that with the two

fabric A units, sew and press. Finally add the last two fabric B units and press.

3. Layer the long fabric C strips along the top and bottom of the sewn unit, right sides together, aligning the raw edges. Trim the strip to length and sew through all layers. Press. Layer the two



1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles from fabric C on each short end of the sewn unit, right sides together and sew through all layers. Press. 4. Repeat the process in step 3 with the unit 3 stripsborder strips. Layer two strips on the longer sides of the sewn unit, sew and press. Trim off the excess fabrics on each side. Repeat with the




short sides of the runner. Trim the backing and batting to the same size as the sewn top.

5. Take the 3" fabric D squares and fold them in half, corner to corner to form a triangle, with wrong sides together as shown. Press. Then refold them into a smaller triangle so that the raw edges are all together and press.

6. Arrange 3 triangles along two edges of the runner (I did the upper right short side and bottom left long side)

and pin down. Let the tips of the triangles overlap about a 1/4". Now sew the binding to the runner, catching

according appliqués to the general instructions. Finish the edges by machine through all



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
