
## Grab N' Go Tote Adjustments



The single pattern Grab N' Go tote was originally published in the Fast & Furious Family book. The size of the tote was adjusted by a little bit when the pattern came out as a single pattern, shrinking the tote by 1" to be able to use 1 yard of fabric for lining.

Here are the adjustments you need to make on the cutting if you have the book, if you want to make the slightly smaller version.




## Cutting

Fabric A: Cut into a 35<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 24<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" rectangle.

**Foam, CrafTex or Batting:** Instead of 13-7/8" x 7" rectangles, cut Four  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $14\frac{3}{8}$ " rectangles. All other sizes are the same.

## Assembly

**Step 3:** Adjust the cutout sizes to 6" x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " as shown.



**Step 5:** I used foam inside my handles.

Step 6: Position the handles 13" from each edge of the sewn unit.
