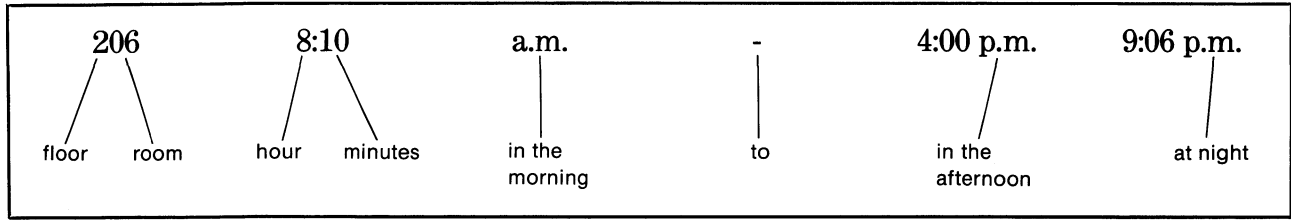

Fri. = Friday      Sat. = Saturday      Feb. = February      Nov. = November

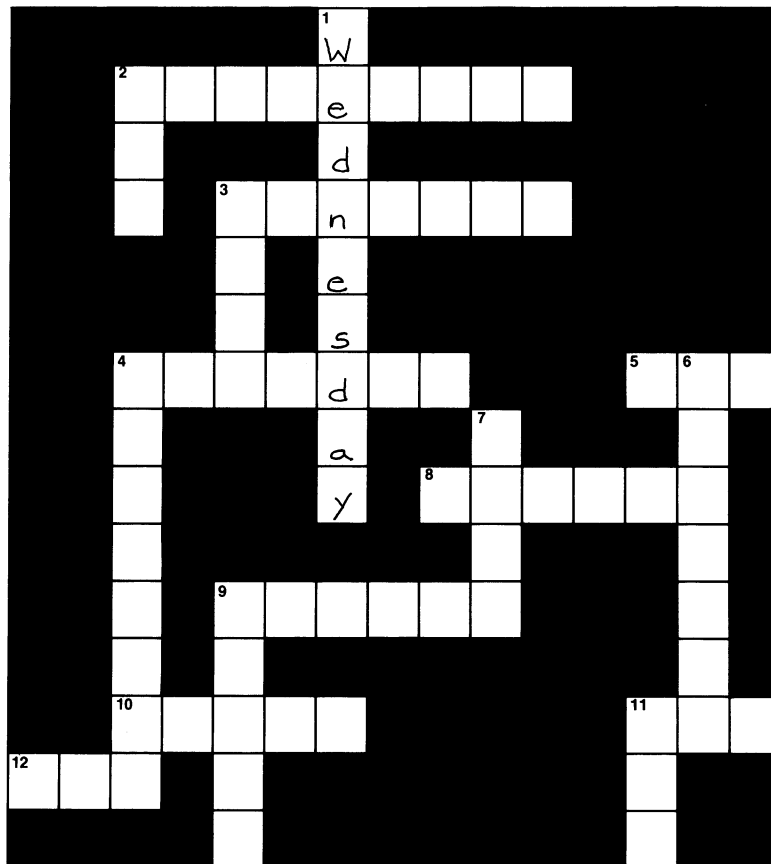
