Abundance

Wealth can come in many forms, whether it be money, success, love or spiritual fulfillment. Let your cup runneth over with any kind of riches you seek.

Ace of Cups

Based on the card from the Minor Arcana of the Tarot, the Ace of Cups signifies a new energy in your emotional, social or spiritual life. Welcome new beginnings in projects or relationships (including romantic love, friendships, or creative relationships), or a renewal of energy in matters that are already underway.

The chalice stands for the vessel of your subconscious, while the ocean wave is your intuition and emotions. The sea behind is the collective human spirit.

Alchemy

The process of psychic transformation occurs in the formula Solve et Coagula, which is to say, destroy and recreate; dissolve and conjoin; break down so as to come back together.

Light for personal transmutation; to alter or reverse circumstances outside the self; to improve health; to align the macrocosm with microcosm; for spiritual and psychological wholeness; for balance.

Ara Kara/Manifest

The “Ara Kara” mantra or quantum sound frequency references primordial sounds in the Universe for creation and manifestation. The “Ah” moves the creative energies found in the sex center, located in the root chakra, up into the center located between the two eyes and eyebrows (area of pineal gland). By moving this energy, you shift its expression from creating life into creating other desires, such as a home, job or relationship.

Ara strengthens your imagination. Kara brings out the manifestation into physical reality. Together they call on the energies of creation, fire and material forces.

Bird of Paradise

In Rus folklore and Greek mythology, the Sirin, or half-woman/half bird, represents eternal joy and heavenly happiness. She is a rare mythological being, residing only in paradise, but those who witness her or hear her song are deemed happy.

Sometimes the Sirin is seen as a metaphor for God’s word entering the soul of a man.

Light for mood boost and building your happiest life.

Cosmic Egg

The egg itself conveys the cosmos, while the hand (of Ananke) is the swirling creative force surrounding it; It is a pervasive creation myth across cultures that the universe sprung from an egg; eggs symbolize unification of complementary principles (yin and yang, the white and yoke) and for regeneration, as the yellow is the sun. The Hindu god Vishnu entered the cosmic egg to retreat before giving birth to Brahma, the Creator, and ancient healing practices mimicked a similar “incubation” period for initiates where they were to withdraw to a cave until ready to emerge renewed.

Light for birth, rebirth, new beginnings; for generative energy, for fertility, for unification and balance of self; for looking inward; for healing.

Cosmic Egg

Cosmic Tree

A tree represents the whole of manifestation; constant renewal and regeneration, resurrection, and reproduction; a tree containing a sun and moon reflects the joining of the macrocosm and microcosm; of heaven and earth.

Trees represent the attainment of esoteric knowledge and the idea of climbing a tree can mean to ascend to other realms for wisdom and magickal powers.

Trees symbolize the feminine principle of nourishing, sheltering and protecting; but also unity of complementary principles of both male and female, or Androgyne; Resembling the human figure, a tree may mean the unification of self.

A tree may represent a beginning and end of a cycle.

Come to Me

“Abracadabra” -said to come from the Hebrew phrase, “abreq ad habra,” meaning “hurl your thunderbolt even unto death.” Or in Aramaic, “avra kehhabra,” translates to, “I will create as I speak.” Regardless, both meanings will empower your wish-speak with intention and stop at nothing to attract for your higher self. Meditate on love, success, wealth, or whatever it is that you wish and know to have coming to you.

Cut and Clear

The broken rose is for love, and the lemons for purification. Let this be your weapon to cut psychic ties to energies that no longer serve your higher self. This is a powerful spell, not to be taken lightly. But commit to cut and clear and you will find freedom, lightness of being and love.

Diana

Diana is so multi-faceted and powerful that she has had cult status in many mystical traditions for millennia. She is known as the goddess of the hunt, fertility, witchcraft, and love between women. Her symbols include the sky and crescent moon and her tools are the bow and arrow. Work with her for help in hitting your mark, whether it be a job, a birth, partnership or any other desired outcome.

The Empress

The Empress of the Major Arcana Tarot deck is the Mother Earth archetype. She asks us to connect with our feminine side. Beauty, creative expression and fertility of ideas (or literal fertility) are her domain. Invoke her to create a feeling of plentifulness in your life and to surrender to the sensual energies of the universe. The act of just feeling abundant creates more abundance, whether it be riches, love or health. We can have it all!

Eros

Eros with his flaming torch lit love in the hearts of men. Whether you prefer to honor the god directly or to embody his energy, petition him with your own flaming torch to grant you sexual heat and/or passionate love. Eros was part of a triad of gods, along with Heracles and Hermes, who bestowed qualities of beauty, strength and eloquence onto male lovers. Like attracts like, so work with this magick and Eros will bless you with a strong, beautiful union.

Four of Wands

The Four of Wands of the minor arcana of the tarot represents joy, celebration, security, and harmony. Light to commemorate a milestone or achievement, and bask in the celebration of having watched your garden grow.

Ganesh

Ganesh is the lord of obstacles, new beginnings, and open roads. Petition him to have the paths to your goals cleared and to place you in the universal flow of potentiality. Let this candle be your offering to Ganesh and trust he will deliver the opportunities you need.

Hecate

In Greek mythology, the triple goddess Hecate controls witchcraft, crossroads, the underworld, dreams, and death. Her symbols are keys that unlock the gates between realms. She is connected to all phases of the moon but is typically associated with new moon.

High John

A popular folk hero in African American lore, High John the Conqueror was said to be an African prince sold into slavery in the Americas, but with his strength of spirit, escaped. Other folklore claims he fell in love with the Devil's daughter, Lilith, was given impossible tasks to win her over, but tricked the devil into stealing her away instead. In both stories he is shown to be a trickster who prevails over any impossible-seeming situation, and he is a celebrated figure in Hoodoo and Voodoo.

Made with 100% soy wax and lightly-scented in black currant, absolute and patchouli. Has 70-hour burn time.

The High Priestess

The High Priestess of the Major Arcana Tarot deck is the guardian of the subconscious. Work with her to guide you to your higher, intuitive self. Creative pursuits as well as healing processes where we have to dig deep require us to access our High Priestess within. She reminds us that the answers to our questions reside within us, we only have to trust ourselves. Her ruling planet is the moon, making the night of a full or new moon an ideal (but not necessary!) first time to light.

Horus

The Eye of Horus is an ancient Egyptian symbol of protection, health and restoration, and the sky god himself is also known as "the avenger of evil." Horus himself stands for the rising sun, while his left eye symbolizes the moon, so let this candlelight shine during daybreak and sunset to reflect all evil onto itself.

House Bless

This flame is a nod to Hestia, the Greek Goddess of the hearth (otherwise known as Vesta, her Roman equivalent). Her essence is symbolized by fire, while the keys symbolize a doorway to your own divinity and psychic space. Burn for peace, protection and tranquility of home and hearth.

Kali

She is the Great Mother and a fierce warrior; the goddess of time and nature, birth and death, rebirth and power. She is the slayer of the ego and killer of demons and evil forces. We commonly worship her during each new moon but show your devotion in any time of need for change, power, and absolving of the ego.

Lilith

Lilith, otherwise known as the Night Flyer, is the revered and feared goddess of the night in Jewish mythology. Before working with Lilith, it's advised that you learn her story and powers, as she had many facets not to be taken lightly! She is often invoked for attraction, sex magic and moon magic. She is associated with the waning or dark moon and is best summoned during these phases. She represents the element air and may be conjured for that energy in your practice.

The Lovers

Summon a dream-like union in our interpretation of the Lovers card of the Tarot. Meant to induce a dissolution of the ego for other-worldly oneness and kundalini cosmic bliss.

Lucky Black Cat

This popular familiar among witches is also a friend to gamblers, known to bring luck in money matters, particularly in card games and the lottery. The cat-as-harbinger of luck extends to all black arts though, including the granting of invisibility and return of lost love.

The Magician

The Magician of the Tarot initiates the process of manifestation. You have all the tools you need to make your dreams come true, you only need to pick them up and put them into practice.

Invoke the Magician for aid in seeing the fruits of your labor ripen; for your thoughts to begin to actualize on the physical plane; for your goals to find an anchor in the macrocosm. In short, she makes your dreams come true.

Magenta Magick/Manifest

Purple, the color of spirituality and intuition, combines with red, which promotes power and vivacity. Their combined magenta asserts strength, optimism, super powers, and fast-acting results, and has a transformative quality. Magenta has the manifestation power to make dreams a reality.

Magenta is a high vibrational frequency that works fast so expect speedy results. Magenta also energizes other rituals where immediate action and high levels of spiritual power or healing are required.

Medusa

Of the Goddess with snakes for hair, The Women's Encyclopedia of Myths and Secrets defines Medusa as, "The Three Queens of Libya—that is, the Triple Goddess, of whom she was the Destroyer aspect. A female face surrounded by serpent-hair is an ancient symbol of divine female wisdom, and equally of wise blood that gave women their divine powers."

Light for attraction, power, wisdom, protection, destruction, and the many other aspects of this Great Goddess we encourage you to discover for yourself.

Mercury

Our ode to Mercury, the god of communication, travel, financial abundance, and boundaries. Mercury also serves the souls of the underworld, so let this light help guide any departed loved ones.

Work with this for all Mercury-related transits and beyond.

Moon Power/Rebirth

As a creature that sheds its skin, the serpent stands for rebirth and transformation. Full and new moons are an ideal time to reassess and start fresh but new beginnings can happen whenever we feel ready to enact change.

Nine of Cups

The Nine of Cups of the Tarot is a wish-fulfilling boon card. This is an energy of abundance, pleasure, and deep satisfaction for having seen your wishes come true, and you can now bask in the emotional fulfillment that comes with it. Light to see your deepest desires delivered and your cups runneth over with contentment and gratitude.

One and Only

Work with this flower power to solidify or celebrate commitment; Give to your one and only to light, or to light to find your one and only. A rose can signify fast luck so expect speedy results.

Oshun

Oshun is one of the Yoruba religion's most popular and powerful deities, or Orishas. As a river deity, she is associated with water, love, the arts, sensuality, purity, fertility and marriage. Her day of the week is Saturday.

Our Lady of Guadalupe

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Mexico's patron Saint, helps heal, grants prayers, opens doors, guides and protects, especially watching over birthing mothers. In Aztec tradition, she is the Earth Goddess of the soil as well as Mother Goddess, known as Tonan, or Tonantzin. The Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, celebrated in Mexico and North America, falls on December 12 near to and in honor of the Winter Solstice.

For altar work, gratitude is key with this goddess and offerings of red roses, chocolate, mangos, pastries, avocado, and apples are appreciated.

Palm of India

Featuring an Indian palmistry hand and a multi-meaning eye and snake, let your intuition and wishes guide you to decide what sort of work to do, whether it be to draw luck, fortune, protection or just aid in daily meditation.

Plant Power

Symbolically, the mushroom evokes unexpected manifestations of what is already proliferating in invisible, vegetative dimensions. What "mushrooms" into our conscious life can function to enchant, expand, alter, nourish, but also to poison. Recommended to support work in trauma, depression, addiction, and shedding fixed patterns of perception and behavior.

Rose Garden/Love Draw

The rose has long been used in love spells and is associated with Aphrodite, Eros and Adonis-powerful allies to petition in your work. Harness this flower power to pull whichever kind of love you seek. In any love work, when we want to attract, best practice is to focus on being love. Find that high vibration, connect to your chosen deity, feel you are that beam of loving light. Like attracts like, that is how you draw!

Santa Clara

Saint Clare of Assisi is the patron saint of fear, anxiety, eyes and seeing. Call upon her for aid when working to remove blockages (that when self-imposed are so often about fear!); when you need to make a decision; when you need someone else to come to a decision, to see you, or to see truth; As the guardian of the eyes, she may also aid in clairvoyance. She is related to any and all matters of sight and clarity.

St. John

According to legend, John was given a cup of poisoned wine that he blessed, turning the contents into a serpent. As emblems of the tale, John's chalice symbolizes divine protection and faith prevailing over death.

Sacred Heart

The flaming heart depicts love, understanding, courage, joy and sorrow; religious fervor, zeal and devotion; The pierced heart is penitence."

Light for love, devotion, strength, courage, truth, passion and healing.

Saturn Return

The term "Saturn Return," a potent astrological transit that occurs three times in our lives, refers to the moment that Saturn returns to the exact placement it was in when you were born. It brings with it turbulence, self-reflection and self-doubt, but if we enter it with intentions to rebuild our personal paradigms, this cosmic rite of passage helps us elevate to our best selves. Light for clarity, calmness, looking inwards, and any other energies that will guide you into the next phase of adulthood.

Summer Solstice

Light for light, as the sun is at its highest point on the Solstice and the day at its longest. Rituals and celebrations to honor this day range the world over but common themes are fertility, ascension, Mother Nature and enlightenment.

The Supercharge w/ Annabel Gat

This candle was made in collaboration with Annabel Gat, in homage to her Aries inclination toward speed (as well as romance and luxury!). Checkerboard print is often seen at races, but has other mystical roots, too, relating to architecture and structure: may this candle light your way as you build your best life! Pink roses are gentle and romantic, imbuing a softness and sense of comfort. Wings symbolize freedom, and jewels, abundance. While wings take us toward the heavens, jewels are of the earth and are often said by mystics to have grounding qualities.

The Sun

Based on the Tarot card from the Major Arcana, the sun represents positivity, success, vitality and warmth. Light for abundance, public successes, sun worship, mood boost, and keeping the flame alive, especially in Winter.

Venus

Venus energy is love energy. Work with her for attraction, to draw love, and for self-love. She loves generously, without ego or judgment, so look to her to release criticism that is reflexive.

Venus also rules money so you may petition her for wealth of not only the heart but also wallet!

Venus is the goddess and patron of the arts and beauty-so artists might work with her to expand their business or creativity.

Wisdom

The owl is considered a powerful guide in evoking spirits and delivering messages from the dead, as they travel freely between the material and spiritual worlds.

Light for wisdom, intuition, renewal and ancestral work.

Winter Solstice

The winter solstice spans many mystical traditions as being a magical time. It represents both the Goddess energy (or the moon) as well as the sun and therefore rebirth. It's a time for personal awakening and looking within; setting goals and intentions. Above all it stands for hope. While we may view winter as never-ending, there is always light after darkness.

The Winter Solstice occurs in the Northern Hemisphere on December 21, 2023.

The World

The World card of the Tarot deck signifies the completion and fulfillment of long-held goals and efforts. What has manifested with the Magician has now come to completion with the World. Work with this energy to see achievements in dreams of any nature, from relationships to projects. The World is the culmination of everything and all.

Tumblers

Arabian Woods

Featuring the Snakes for Hair name in old Russian script on florals and moorish arabesques. Light for altar ambience, to bolster other magick, or feel-good vibes for the home

Lightly-scented in oud, smoke, amber and musk. Oud enhances meditation, banishes negativity, promotes sleep, and enhances a mood of a home; Amber stands for protection, luck and solar energies; Musk is an aphrodisiac; Smoke represents air and is a conduit for communication with spirit. Has a 50-hour burn time.

Black Violet

This moody flower is to inspire magick in later hours and shorter days. Read the Brontë Sisters and penny dreadfuls by the candlelight of our most gothic offering. "Your will shall decide your destiny."

Made of 100% black soy wax and lightly-scented in black violet, which supports protection, luck, love, lust, wishes, peace and healing, and saffron, encouraging love, healing, happiness, lust, strength and psychic powers. Has a 50-hour burn time.

Come to Me

Featuring the occult symbol of the inverted abracadabra triangle and ever-popular and magickal rose. "Abracadabra," coming from the Aramaic word "avra keh-dabra," translates to, "I will create as I speak"

Made of 100% black soy wax and scented in rose. Has a 50-hour burn time.

Hecate

In Greek mythology, the triple goddess Hecate controls witchcraft, crossroads, the underworld, dreams, and death. Her symbols are keys that unlock the gates between realms. She is connected to all phases of the moon but is typically associated with new moon.

Made of 100% black soy wax and lightly-scented in honeysuckle for psychic powers, money, and protection, and jasmine for love, money and prophetic dreams. And like Hecate, jasmine is connected to the moon. Has a 50 hour burn time.

Medusa

Featuring our inverted Medusa triangle logo. Made with 100% black soy wax and lightly-scented in absinthe, black currant and patchouli. Absinthe, or wormwood, supports clairvoyance, divination, love, protection, psychic development, banishing work, calling of spirits and spell-breaking; black currant protects the home from negative energies; patchouli is associated with money, lust and fertility.

Made with 100% soy wax and lightly-scented in black currant, absinthe and patchouli. Has 70-hour burn time.

Night Bazaar

Scented in sandalwood, musk and leather, Night Bazaar is your magic carpet to nighttime souks of faraway lands, filled with potions and perfumes that inspire spell work. Light for night ambience and rituals in darker hours and colder months. Sandalwood has a calming effect and is used for protection, healing, and connecting with the divine; Musk is an aphrodisiac; leather is a symbol of strength and wisdom and a conductor of earth energy.

Has a 50 hour burn time.

Roma Villa

Featuring Venus-Aphrodite statues in an all-over print and lightly-scented in rose and oud. Rose is associated with fast luck, love, healing, psychic powers, divination, and protection; Oud aids in meditation, banishes negativity, promotes sleep, acts as an aphrodisiac and enhances a mood of a home.

Made with 100% soy wax and lightly-scented in rose and oud. Has 70-hour burn time.

Rose Garden/Love Draw

This rosey bouquet may serve as altar ambience, bolster other magick, or feel-good vibes for the home. Featuring the all-powerful rose, which has always had a tradition of magick. Roses may offer fast luck, love, healing, psychic powers, divination, and protection. They are associated with Hathor, Hulda, Harpocrates, Aurora, Cupid, Eros, Demeter, Isis, Adonis and Cupid.

Made with 100% soy wax and lightly-scented in rose. Has a 50 hour burn time.

Rose Oud

This faraway flame conjures the Hanging Gardens of Babylon. Rose is associated with fast luck, love, healing, psychic powers, divination, and protection; Oud enhances meditation, banishes negativity, promotes sleep, and enhances a mood of a home.

Made with 100% black soy wax and lightly-scented in rose and oud.
Has a 50 hour burn time.
