

# ARAN OUTLINE

GENEROUS COZY WRAP

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SIMPLE IN CONSTRUCTION, THIS WRAP LETS YOUR YARNS SHINE AND YOUR MIND REST. IT'S A VERY EASY, ENJOYABLE KNIT, WITH A GREAT KNITTING RHYTHM. EASILY ADAPTABLE, IN TERMS OF LENGTH, WIDTH AND COLOURS.



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## ABBREVIATIONS

**RS** - right side

**WS** - wrong side

**k** - knit

**p** - purl

**yo** - yarn over, one stitch increased

**ssk** - I usually do a quick version as follows: slip one stitch knitwise, return stitch to the left needle, knit two stitches together through the back loop

**k2tog** - knit two stitches together

**k2togtbl** - knit two stitches together through back loop

# OVERVIEW

YARN	Size pictured used 5 skeins Hedgehog Fibres Merino Aran, 166m/100g, colour Graphite
NEEDLE	5mm or to obtain gauge, the wrap is worked flat
GAUGE	18 stitches and 24 rows = 4"/10cm in stockinette worked flat, after light blocking
SIZE	47cm x 160cm
TOOLS	Stitch markers might be useful to separate pattern repeats
SKILLS REQUIRED	casting on, casting off, increases, decreases
SHARE	#aranoutline We love to see your progress!

# INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 95 stitches using your preferred cast on method. I like German Twisted cast on using a larger needle, we want something nice and stretchy.

Row 1 (RS): (k5, yo, k8, ssk, k5, k2tog, k8, yo) 3 times, k5

Row 2 (WS): (k5, p10) 6 times, k5

That's it!

Repeat these two rows until the wrap is the desired length, or until you run out of yarn.

Cast off your scarf using a stretchy cast off method ([Jeny's surprisingly stretchy cast off is a good one.](#)) If you are a loose knitter like myself, the following cast off might work for you:

k2, pass both stitches to left needle and k2togtbl, \*(k1, pass the stitch to left needle, k2togtbl) repeat from \*

If you'd like a narrower or wider scarf, the repeat is multiple of 30 stitches + 5 stitches.

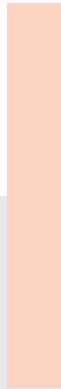
## **Finishing:**

Weave in your ends if needed, block lightly.

## Care Notes

Whether you are using commercially dyed yarn or lovely hand-dyed skeins, please keep in mind that colours might bleed. None of the examples shown bled, but I always knit up a sample and wash it as you would your finished item to be sure. Please use common sense, reds and crazy pinks tend to bleed the most, any red/white combo is probably not a good idea (we separate laundry, right?). To minimise bleeding, gently soak the swatch and finished item in cold water with a mild detergent or wool wash. The gentler you wash your project the better it will look over time.
