

## OVERVIEW

YARN 3 skeins of Hedgehog Fibres Super Bulky (100% Merino, 82m/150g).

The colourway pictured is 'Moon Stone'.

NEEDLE US15 / 10mm needles, shawl is worked flat, but circular needle

might be beneficial in order to accommodate the a large number of stitches towards the end. Adjust needle size to obtain correct

gauge.

GAUGE 7 sts and 11 rows = 4" / 10 cm in stockinette, blocked lightly by was-

hing and laying flat to dry

SIZE 152cm wide and 71cm deep (60 x 28 inches)

TOOLS Stitch markers if desired.

SKILLS REQUIRED Casting on, casting off, increases, decreases

## INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 3 stitches and continue with the Garter Tab cast on as follows: Knit 6 rows. Knit 7th row, do not turn, then pick up 3 stitches along the border of the small garter rectangle you have just knit. Pick up and knit 1 stitch in each of the 3 cast-on stitches. 9 stitches on the needle.

### Section 1: Stockinette body of the shawl

Row 1 (RS): K3, yo, k1, yo, k1 (mark this stitch = centre stitch), yo, k1, yo, k3 [13 stitches]

Row 2 (WS): k3, p7, k3

Row 3 (RS): k3, yo, k to marked st, yo, k centre stitch, yo, k to 3 stitches before end of row, yo, k3 Row 4 (WS): k3, p to 3 stitches before end of row, k3

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until 47 stitches in each stockinette section finishing with a WS row; 101 stitches in total

Stitches on needle = 3 (garter edge) + 47 (stockinette section) + 1(centre stitch) + 47 stockinette section) + 3 (garter edge) = 101 stitchess.

### Section 2: Lace border (Chart on page 6)

You will now begin the lace border section of the shawl. Start with Row 1 of the chart; written instructions are also provided.

The chart represents only one half of the triangle shawl and must be worked twice per row as follows:

Row 1: K3, \*work chart\*, k, \*work chart\*, k3 Row 2: K3, \*work chart\*, p, \*work chart\*, k3

Note that the centre stitch of each row must be worked in either k or p before the second chart repeat is worked.

Also note that the boxed section indicated within the chart is a repeat motif and should be worked three times consecutively each half row.

### Written instructions (Lace Border Chart on page 6)

Arrows before row numbers indicate direction of the charted rows: Row 1 of the chart is followed right to left, Row 2 you follow left to right etc.


- ← Row 1 [RS]: yo, p2, yo, (k, yo, p2, ssk, k5, k2tog, p2, yo) x3, k, yo, p2, yo
- $\rightarrow$  Row 2 [WS]: k3, p2, (p, k2, p7, k2, p2) x3 p, k3
- ← Row 3 [RS]: yo, p3, k, yo, (k, yo, k, p2, ssk, k3, k2tog, p2, k, yo) x3, k, yo, k, p3, yo
- → Row 4 [WS]: k4, p3, (p2, k2, p5, k2, p3) x3, p2, k4
- ← Row 5 [RS]: yo, p4, k2, yo, (k, yo, k2, p2, ssk, k, k2tog, p2, k2, yo) x3, k, yo, k2, p4, yo
- → Row 6 [WS]: k5, p4, (p3, k2, p3, k2, p4) x3, p3, k5
- ← Row 7 [RS]: p2, k, p2, k3, yo, (k, yo, k3, p2, cdd, p2, k3, yo) x3, k, yo, k3, p2, k, p2
- $\rightarrow$  Row 8 [WS]: k2, p, k2, p5, (p4, k2, p, k2, p5) x3, p4, k2, p, k2
- ← Row 9 [RS]: yo, p2, yo, k, yo, p2, ssk, k2, (k3, k2tog, p2, yo, k, yo, p2, ssk, k2) x3, k3, k2tog, p2, yo, k, yo, p2, yo
- → Row 10 [WS]: k3, p3, k2, p4, (p3, k2, p3, k2, p4) x3, p3, k2, p3, k3
- ← Row 11 [RS]: yo, p3, k, yo, k, yo, k, p2, ssk, k, (k2, k2tog, p2, k, yo, k, yo, k, p2, ssk, k1) x3, k2, k2tog, p2, k, yo, k, yo, k, p3, yo
- → Row 12 [WS]: k4, p5, k2, p3, (p2, k2, p5, k2, p3) x3, p2, k2, p5, k4
- ← Row 13 [RS]: yo, p4, k2, yo, k, yo, k2, p2, ssk, (k, k2tog, p2, k2, yo, k, yo, k2, p2, ssk) x3, k, k2tog, p2, k2, yo, k, yo, k2, p4, yo
- → Row 14 [WS]: k5, p7, k2, p2 (p, k2, p7, k2, p2) x3, p, k2, p7, k5
- $\leftarrow$  Row 15 [RS]: p2, k, p2, k3, yo, k, yo, k3, p2, (cdd, p2, k3, yo, k, yo, k3, p2,) x3, cdd, p2, k3, yo, k, yo, k3, p2, k, p2
- → Row 16 [WS]: k2, p, k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p, (k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p) x3, k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p, k2
- ← Row 17 [RS]: yo, p2, k, p2, k3, p, k, p, k3, p2, (k, p2, k3, p, k, p, k3, p2) x3, k, p2, k3, p, k, p, k3, p2, k, p2, vo
- → Row 18 [WS]: k3, p, k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p, (k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p) x3, k2, p3, k, p, k, p3, k2, p, k3

### Cast off loosely in pattern.

Weave in ends and block lightly by laying flat to dry.

### **CARE NOTES**

Whether you are using commercially dyed yarn or lovely hand-dyed skeins, please keep in mind that colours might bleed. None of the examples shown bled, but I always knit up a sample and wash it as you would your finished item to be sure. Please use common sense - reds and crazy pinks tend to bleed the most, any red/white combo is probably not a good idea (we separate laundry, right?). To minimise bleeding, gently soak the swatch/finished item in cold water with a mild detergent or wool wash. The gentler you wash your project the better it will look over time.
