



PUFFBALL WRAP

SUPER BULKY VOLUMINOUS SHAWL
BY BEATA JEZEK







EASY, MINDLESS GARTER STITCH SHAWL, SUITABLE EVEN FOR BEGINNERS. JUST RELAX WITH A FLUFFY YARN AND KNIT A FEW ROWS, NOTHING TOO DIFFICULT GOING ON HERE.

THE FINISHED WRAP IS A PLUSH LUXURIOUS CARRIE-STYLE SHAWL AND OH SO SOFT!



ABBREVIATIONS

k - knit

p - purl

yo - yarn over

 ${f kfb}$ - knit into the front and then the back of the same stitch

kyok - knit, yo, knit into the same stitch

 ${\bf ssk}$ - slip the first stitch as if to knit, slip the second stitch as if to knit, knit these two stitches together through the back.



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OVERVIEW

Hedgehog Fibres Super Bulky, 4 skeins (4x 150g). Colourway pictured is YARN

Puffball.

NEEDLE 10mm circular needle, longer cable will be needed towards the end as there

will be a lot of stitches. The shawl is knittted flat.

GAUGE 7 sts and 14 rows = 10cm in garter stitch, after light blocking

DIMENSIONS 170cm wingspan and 50cm deep

> **TOOLS** large blunt tapestry needle to weave in ends, large crochet hook for adding

the fringe

SKILLS REQUIRED knitting, increases

> SHARE #puffballwrap

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INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 3 stitches.

Setup:

Row 1(RS): k1, yo, k2 Row 2 (WS): k4

Row 3(RS): k2, yo, k2 Row 4 (WS): k2, kfb, k2

Row 5(RS): k2, kyok, k1, ssk Row 6 (WS): k to last 4 st. kfb, k3

Row 7(RS): k2, kyok, k to last 2 stitches, ssk

Row 8 (WS): k to last 4 st. kfb, k3

Repeat rows 7 and 8, until you have approx. 50g left of the last ball. Cast off using your favourite method.

The remainder of the yarn will be used for the fringe. Cut your yarn into 20cm pieces and add your fringe to the cast off edge using a crochet hook. Check out this tutorial, or my instagram reel tutorial.

Finishing:

Weave in your ends, block lightly to smooth out stitches.

Whether you are using commercially dyed yarn or lovely hand-dyed skeins, please keep in mind that colours might bleed. None of the examples shown bled, but I always knit up a sample and wash is as you would your finished item to be sure. Please use common sense, reds and crazy pinks tend to bleed the most, any red/white combo is probably not a good idea. (We separate laundry, right?) To minimise bleeding, gently soak the swatch and finished item in cold water with a mild detergent or wool wash. The gentler you wash your project the better it will look over time.





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
