

ABBREVIATIONS

RS - right side

WS - wrong side

k - knit

p - purl

yo - yarn over

kfb - knit into the front and then the back of the same stitch

kyok - knit, yo, knit into the same stitch

ssk - slip the first stitch as if to knit, slip the second stitch as if to knit,

knit these two stitches together through the back.



OVERVIEW

YARN 2 skeins of Hedgehog Fibres Oh So Fine (100% Merino, 425m/100g),

one colour each.

Pictured in Kelp (A) and Taffy (B).

NEEDLE 4.5 mm/ US 7 or to obtain gauge, the scarf is worked flat, though

circular needle might be beneficial due to large number of stitches

towards the end.

GAUGE 20 stitches and 40 rows = 4"/10cm in garter stitch, after light bloc-

king

SIZE 160cm x 65cm (63 inches x 26 inches)

TOOLS Stitch markers if desired, scale to determine the amount of leftovers

SKILLS REQUIRED Casting on, casting off, increases

INSTRUCTIONS

With Colour A, cast on 3 stitches.

Setup:

Row 1 (RS): k1, yo, k2 Row 2 (WS): k4

Row 3 (RS): k2, yo, k2 Row 4 (WS): k2, kfb, k2 Row 5 (RS): k2, kyok, k1, ssk

Row 6 (WS): k to last 4 st. kfb, k3 (8 stitches)

Body of shawl:

Row 7 (RS): k2, kyok, k to last 2 stitches, ssk Row 8 (WS): k to last 4 st. kfb, k3 (10 stitches)

Repeat Rows 7 and 8, until you have approx. 25g left of Colour A, then join in Colour B on a right side row and continue in 2 row stripes while repeating Rows 7 and 8 until there are 240 stitches.

Next Row: Work Row 7 once more.

Next Row: k (241 stitches)

(For bigger/smaller shawl modifications: the Feather and Fan border needs multiples of 17 + 3 end of row stitches)

Break Colour A.

Start Feather and Fan border with Colour B:

Row 1 (RS): k

Row 2 (WS): p to last 3, k3

Row 3 (RS): *(k2tog, k2tog, y0, k1, y0, k1, y0, k1, y0, k1, y0, k1, y0, ssk, ssk, ssk) repeat from * until

last 3 st., k3 Row 4 (WS): k

Repeat rows 1-4, 14 more times.

Cast off using a picot cast off (link), picot every 5 stitches.

Picot cast off

Cast on 2, cast off 7, cast on 2, cast off 7... continue to cast on 2, cast off 7 until last stitch, cast off 1.

Finishing:

Weave in your ends, block lightly.

CARE NOTES

Whether you are using commercially dyed yarn or lovely hand-dyed skeins, please keep in mind that colours might bleed. None of the examples shown bled, but I always knit up a sample and wash it as you would your finished item to be sure. Please use common sense - reds and crazy pinks tend to bleed the most, any red/white combo is probably not a good idea (we separate laundry, right?). To minimise bleeding, gently soak the swatch/finished item in cold water with a mild detergent or wool wash. The gentler you wash your project the better it will look over time.
