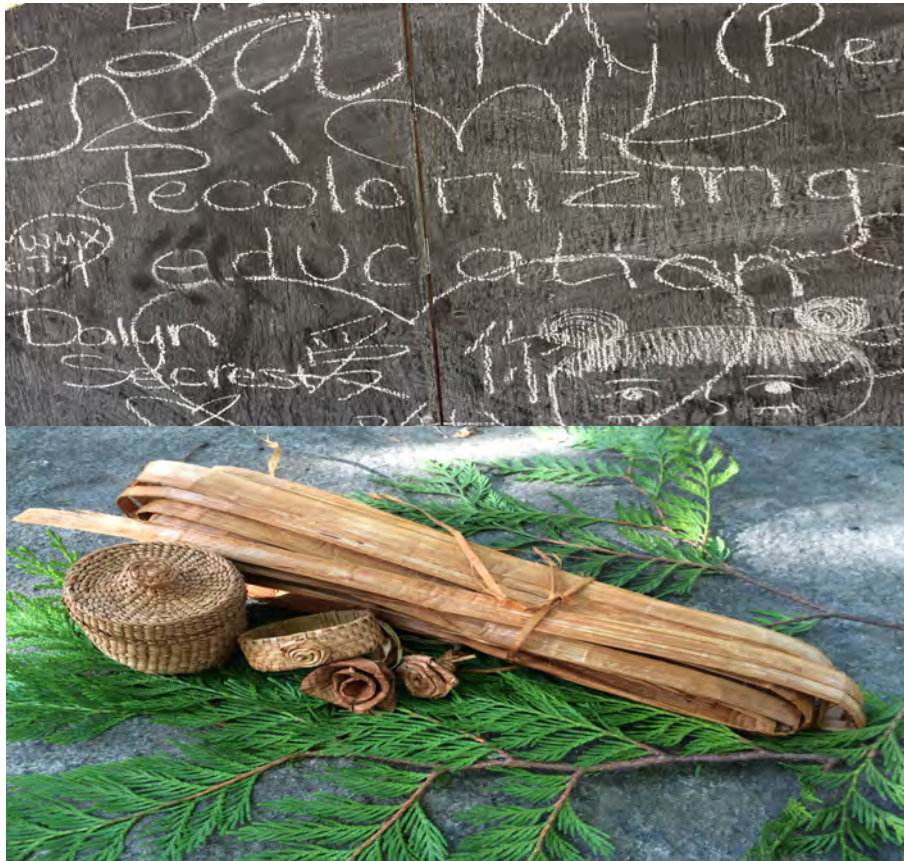


Bringing your students to the Bill Reid Gallery: What you need to know



Welcome to the Bill Reid Gallery of Northwest Coast Art!

We are excited to have your class participate in our education program. Our goal is to introduce students to the rich Indigenous cultures of the Northwest Coast and learn about prolific Haida artist, Bill Reid. In the program, we will explore Reid's iconic works and talk about current Indigenous issues. We are also pleased to offer customizable programs based on your class goals and learning outcomes.

Booking Tours

To book your education program, please use our [online booking form](#). We request you give at least **two weeks notice** from the time of booking. If you have any questions, please contact Jordie Luggi, our Education Coordinator at education@billreidgallery.ca or call **604.682.2455 ext.229**.

The booking form will ask for the following information:

- ✓ Your contact information, including school name, address, and phone number.
- ✓ Three possible dates and times for your program.
- ✓ The number of students and grade level that will be participating.
- ✓ Desired outcomes/topics that you would like to see in the program.

Confirmation

All teachers will be sent a confirmation e-mail within 24 hours after booking their education program.

Cancellation

We ask that we receive ONE WEEK notice of cancellation for any of our education programs. We do not require a deposit to hold your date in order to make our programs more accessible, but a **fee of \$50.00 per program** will be charged if cancellation notice is received less than 1 week prior to your scheduled program.

Program Details

Program Rates

The rate for our program is \$7.50 per student for a regular school program (tax included). Teachers are free, and one chaperone per every ten students receives free admission as well (30 students, 1 free teacher + 3 free chaperones) .

Upon confirmation of program booking, you will receive an invoice. Teachers must pay upon arrival at the front desk. We accept cash, MC/VISA, Interac, or cheque for the entire group.

Arrival Times

Please plan to arrive 15 minutes before your program start time. In case of delay, please call **604.682.3455**.

Program Length

Our programs are generally 90 minutes in length and can accommodate a single class of a **maximum 30 students**. Our gallery space is limited and in order to ensure that every student has a great experience, we ask that programs have no more than 30 students. Our start times and booking dates are open and flexible.

Facilities

Indoor lunch space is available in our Hummingbird Education Space. Let the Education Specialist know if you would like to use this amenity. There are also many wonderful outdoor spaces for lunch in the area and various food courts in the downtown area. In nice weather, our new outdoor Pavilion space will also be available. Teachers are responsible for ensuring the provided space is left clean. We provide garbage and recycling bins.

Backpacks, water bottles, and food are not permitted in the gallery space. Storage is provided for students to keep their belongings.
