The flat scallop sections are 8" to 28" wide. Depth of valance is 16" with a short point of 12". Depth of valance is easy to alter at the top of the pattern. Choose from a variety of pleat styles. The View D rosette pattern is included. This valance can install on a curtain rod, pole with rings, or a board mount.

Fabric Suggestions: Soft fabrics and lightweight, crisp fabrics work best. Avoid extremely bulky fabrics. Views A, B, C and D have crinoline encased across the entire top of the valance. Views E and F have crinoline in flat scallops and returns only. If your fabric requires a little body in the pleats, add a lightweight interfacing to those areas.

YARDAGE

Determine how many flat scallop sections you need by simply dividing your window width into equal units of the size you desire, between 8" and 28".

With so many different fabric widths and repeats available today, we find it works best if we give you the actual pattern sizes so you can determine how they will fit on your fabric. Pattern pieces can be overlapped to eliminate some of the seams when fabric allows.

Flat scallop section	the pattern is	your size plus 1" x 17" deep
Return	the pattern is	7" wide x 16" deep
View A Pleat	-	-
View B and C Pleat	the pattern is	10" wide x 17" deep
View D Pleat	the pattern is	10" wide x 17" deep
View E Pleat	the pattern is	10" wide x 16" deep
View F Pleat	the pattern is	6" wide x 17" deep

Lining: All styles are to be lined. Views E and F will expose the lining at the top of the pleats. A decorative constrast lining should be used.

Crinoline used in View A, B, C and D is a strip of stiffener (usually 4" deep), that is used for pinch pleated draperies. A stiff interfacing can be used instead.

Bottom trim: Add about 3" to each of your flat scallops width size and the width for each pleat used. This should be enough to include returns.

View C: Ribbon $(1/4^{11} \text{ or } 1/2^{11} \text{ wide } 25^{11} \text{ per pleat.}$

View D: 1/2 yard will get 6 rosettes. Each rosette will need a 1" button.
