

Width Adjustments

(Face can be any depth)


LP-21



One horizontal repeat can adjust between 30" and up, measuring straight across the face. The difference in deep point and short point is 3", with the top protruding up another 5". From the extreme top to the bottom of the leg is 42".

(This is 1 repeat)


LP-22



One horizontal repeat can adjust between 30" and up, measuring straight across the face. The top center drops down 1 1/4". The short leg is 30 1/2" deep, the other leg is 48". The legs can also be made wider.

(This is 1 repeat)


LP-23



One horizontal repeat can adjust between 30" and 55", measuring straight across the face. The difference in deep point and short point is 8". From the extreme top to the bottom of the leg is 36". The legs can also be made wider.

(This is one repeat)

LP-24



One horizontal repeat can adjust between 35" and up, measuring straight across the face. The difference in deep point and short point is 7 1/2". From the extreme top to the bottom of the leg is 36". Legs can be curved or straight. Legs can also be made wider.

(This is 1 repeat)

YARDAGE

For the width, allow for the flat front, plus seams and returns.

Allow for the deepest depth, plus at least 2".

Yardage for trims should be decided after your selection of size, and after alterations have been made to the pattern.
