



## Drapery Swags III

These swags are usually placed in front of a drapery and attached to the same rod. **View 1** is created using swag pattern G. The side horns are cut separately and sewn to the swag to become a part of it. **View 2** is created from swag pattern H. **View 3** is created by combining the two patterns before cutting the fabric. **All swag widths will adapt 16" to 22" with the depth varying from 24" to 23"**. These swags have 4 folds. **The jabot hangs about 78" deep**. It has a return and cannot be altered.

**Drapery swags are more effective with a heavy trim. Measurements above do not include trim.**

**Fabric Suggestions:** All fabrics must be soft. Fabric bulk can be a problem in the pleat stack up on the swags. The jabot will have no bulk problems, the fabric can be as thick as you like as long as it is soft. The jabot should be self or contrast lined. Stripes are not a good choice for the jabot. If no trim is being used, the lining may show around the edge on all swags.

### YARDAGE

With so many different fabric widths and repeats available today, we find it works best if we give you the actual pattern sizes so you can determine how they will fit on your fabric.

Jabot.....the pattern is .....36" wide x 84" deep  
 Swag (View 1).....the pattern is .....39" wide x 39" deep  
 Swag (View 2) .....the pattern is .....37" wide x 37" deep  
 Swag (View 3) .....the pattern is .....37" wide x 37" deep  
 Horn.....the pattern is .....14" wide x 22" deep

Two horns are needed for View 1, one horn is needed for View 3.

Same amount of lining will be needed.

#### Yardage for Trims

Trims must be able to curve.

Swag View 1 (includes horns)..... 49"  
 Swag View 2..... 55"  
 Swag View 3 (includes horn)..... 52"  
 Each Jabot..... 111"
