

4-Cut Pillow Collection

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
The fronts of these pillows are cut into four sections, allowing numerous possibilities for design, from a simple stripe fabric or you may use multiple fabrics.


Fabric suggestions: Any fabric can be used for the pillow front since the 4 cuts can be stabilized with a front base, cut from lining. This lining can be regular drapery lining. Bulk is not a problem for the face and back, but bulk is a problem for the cord trim. Instructions are included for covering a cord, but bulky fabrics will be difficult. Purchased cords can also be used.

YARDAGE

The back of the pillow fabric needs to be your pillow size, plus 1-inch. The same applies to the pillow front lining. The lining will be used to lay the decorative front against, after the 4 pieces have been sewn together.

Four cuts are needed for the front. The size of each cut is:





This is your pillow size plus 1 inch

1/2 of your pillow size plus 1 inch

The 4 cuts for the front can be laid out on the fabric as shown (if fabric design permits):



Some stripes may have a repeat that will require the pattern pieces to be laid out in a way that will cause some waste. This should be taken into consideration when deciding yardage.

A purchased pillow insert will be needed as the filler. Hook and loop tape is used for closure.
