
Monroe Valance 9331

This design was inspired for people who want a simple and professional-looking window treatment that is very easy to make. This design is the same as Window #357 in the M'Fay Designer's Digest.

There are a variety of width sizes for the valance sections. There is also a 6" wide accent piece that is optional to use between the valance sections. Also included, is a decorative tail piece that is optional to use at each end.

Each **valance section** is made as a flat piece (contrast lined). When placed over a pole, the back of the valance **can hang 19" or up to 21"** deep at the deepest point. How deep the valance hangs will affect how



much contrast lining is showing. For example, if the back of the valance hangs 19", the front will hang 17", and about 2" of contrast lining will show. If the back of the valance hangs 21", the front will hang 15", and about 6" of contrast lining will show. Alteration instructions are included to make the valance any depth.

As is, the **decorative tail is 5" wide** at the top **and 32" deep**. It does not have a return, which makes it important to use decorative brackets to install the pole. The tail can be altered in depth. It is about 81/2" wide at the widest part. It attaches to the top of the pole with hook and loop tape, or staples.

The 6" accent piece finishes at 50" deep. This allows it to hang 28" in back and 22" in front. This piece can be altered to any depth.

**Fabric Suggestions:** Light, medium or heavy fabrics can be used. With light fabrics, use an interlining. Everything should be self or contrast lined.

**Trims:** Because of the intricate shape, trims will be more difficult to apply. A small cord (optional) can be stitched into the outside seams of all pieces.

## **YARDAGE**

To determine your valance section size, subtract 5" for each decorative tail and 6" for each accent piece used. Then divide by the number of sections desired. You can also mix sizes. To use the patterns, **sizes need to stay between 34" to 48".** 

With so many different fabric widths and repeat sizes available today, we find it works best if we give you the actual pattern sizes so you can determine how they will fit on your fabric.

## **Upright Cut:**

**Lengthwise Cut:** The width measurement will run with the selvage.

Same amount of contrast lining will be needed for all the above.

Same amount of interlining (optional).

Tassels are optional.
