
Harrisburg Valance

9341

This design was inspired for people who want a simple and professional-looking window treatment that is easy to make. This design is the same as Window #584 in the M'Fay Designer's Digest.

This pole mounted treatment consists of flat scallop shaped sections with a double horn placed in between and at the ends. A simple return is included.

Measurements are shown in the sketch. All measurements are taken from the top of a 2" pole. The droop area underneath the pole is 1 1/2".



Fabric Suggestions: Use light to medium weight fabrics that are not too stiff. Add interlining to light weight fabrics. Stripes and plaids will not remain straight on the horns. Horns and returns should be self or contrast lined. Drapery lining can be used for the scallop sections. However, lining may tend to show at the bottom edge if a trim or cord is not used.

If cording is used it is recommended that it be no more than 1/4". Larger cord may keep the double horn folds from laying correctly. Cord or trims should not be stiff.

YARDAGE

With so many different fabric widths and repeats available today, we find it works best if we give you the actual pattern sizes so you can determine how they will fit on your fabric.

Each Scallop Section	the pattern isyo	ur width plus 1" x 20" deep	
Each Double Horn	the pattern is	23" wide x 17" deep	
Each Return	the pattern is	8" wide x 23" deep	

Same amount of lining and (optional) interlining needed for all items. (See fabric suggestions)

TRIM (Trims must be able to curve)

Each Scallop Section	your width plus 2"
Each Double Horn	-
Each Return	10"
