WEEK 1 (FEB 12-18TH)

During the week of February 19 – 25, several PTA alumni showcased skills and contributed significantly to their respective college teams. Here's a summary of their statistics for the week:

KEEGAN MCCARTY, of McKendree University, made his third start of the season, pitching 5 solid innings, allowing only 3 hits while recording 6 strikeouts.

For Upper Iowa University, **ETHAN SAWYER** contributed offensively going 1 for 3 with a walk, sacrifice fly, and RBI in a win for the Peacocks.

For Viterbo University, **NATHAN FAUST**, started a game at second base and went 1 for 4 at the plate, contributing a run scored to V-Hawks' efforts.

Representing the College of Lake County, **RYDER DEROUIN** made his make with a timely 2-run single, contributing to offensive output of the Lancers.
