


1.2 Physical Geography of Africa

1.3 Population Density and Settlement Patterns of Africa:


Population density measures how close people are to one another. Areas with high population density have many people living in a small space, whereas low population density means people live spread apart.

What might explain the lack of dense population in the northern part of the continent?


What problems might arise from the most densely population areas?

How does the climate in the savanna differ from the tropical rainforest?


What climate is found near the Sahara and Sahel?

1.6 Deforestation in Africa:

Deforestation is the intentional clearing of large parts of land. Some African nations' economies depend on crops, but it has negative impacts on the environment.

Deforestation in rainy areas erodes soil and causes good soil to wash away, often into nearby waters, which can then negatively impact fish population.
