

# David Austin Rose class checklist:

Use this handy checklist to make sure you have everything needed to join me for the hands-on David Austin Rose Master Classes!

## Sugar:

- 25g / no.14 (measured using the Size Guide) in colour of your choice. For the darker centre I used pink and peach to make a coral / blush colour but you can use whichever colour you prefer.
- 40g / no.15 white
- 16g / no.12 white
- 30g / no.15 small green – I used moss green but you can choose your shade.

## Air Drying Clay (ADC):

- 8g / no.14 colour of your choice – see above.
- 12g / no.15 white
- 4.5g / no.12 white
- 10g / no.15 small green shade of your choice

**Please have sugar / clay ready to go – coloured, and measured on scales or Size Guide.**

## Flower Pro Products:

- Ultimate Petal Veiner
- Multi Leaf Veiner
- Rose Cones and Thorns Mould
- Calyx Trio Mould
- Five Petal Rose Cutters - Set of 3  
(we will use all 3: 70mm / 90mm / 110 mm)
- Leaf Cutters - Set of 4  
(we will use XL size only: 60mm x 40mm)

## Plus:

- 50mm (2 inches) Five Petal Blossom Cutter – PME produce a version called an XL Five Petal Cutter, many options exist, but if you don't have one, don't worry, we will provide a downloadable template to adjust your 70mm Flower Pro Petal Cutter.
- 5 x 24g half length (18cm / 7 inches) white wires
- 4 x 20g half length white or green wires
- 3 x 26g third length green wires
- Half width white and light green floral tape – Note: if you prefer a darker coloured rose you can use moss or dark green tape instead of light green tape.
- Foam pieces to support petals (for sugar)
- Dusting powders to give slightly darker shading on edges of petals – I will be using a pink / peach combination
- Very pale green and darker green dusting powders
- Green dusting powder for the leaves
- General flower making equipment (See the *Hands-on Class Basics* PDF available to download from the Members Facebook Group.)

## Additional tools:

- Jumbo ball tool or 2.5cm (1 inch) styrene ball or marble for cupping petals.
