Presiding Priest:

The The Nicene Creed:

We believe in one God, the Father. the Almightv. maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to offer thanks and praise.


It is right indeed it is our joy and our salvation, holy Lord, almighty Father, everlasting God, at all times and in places to give you thanks and praise through Christ your only Son.


The Presiding Priest continues:

All glory and thanksgiving, holy Father; on the night before he died, your Son, Jesus Christ, took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me. After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.



Therefore loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ our great high priest.

Send your Holy Spirit that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of your kingdom. 

Communion Sentence:

Act of Spiritual Communion

St Thomas Aquinas defined Spiritual Communion as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embracing Him as if we had actually received Him." Our New Zealand Prayer Book puts it this way (p.729): "When people who desire to receive the Holy Communion are unable to do so for any other reason, their desire and such prayers as they are able to offer ensure that they do spiritually receive the body and blood of Christ."

A Prayer that you may wish to use:

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
