ASCENSION DAY Te Rā Kakenga

This service from the Book of Common Prayer dates back to the 16th century. The Choir and Minister sing the whole service, except for the Confession and Apostles' Creed which are said together.

The Introit: Viri Galilaei

Viri Galilaei, quid admiramini aspicientes in caelum? Alleluia. Quemadmodum vidistis eum ascendentem in caelum, ita veniet, Alleluia. Omnes gentes plaudite manibus: Jubilate Deo in voce exsultationis. Gloria Patri, et Filio, et Spiritui Sancto. Sicut erat in principio, et nunc, et semper, et in saecula saeculorum. Amen.

Translation:

You men of Galilee, why stand you looking into heaven? Alleluia! He shall so come as you have seen him going into heaven. Alleluia! All nations, clap your hands. Make a joyful sound to God with the sound of rejoicing. Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, As it was in the beginning, and now, and always, and into ages of ages. Amen.

May the Almighty and merciful Lord grant unto you pardon and remission of all your sins, time for amendment of life, and the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Amen.

The Collect for Peace:

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all just works do proceed: Give unto thy servants that peace which the world cannot give; that both our hearts may be set to obey thy commandments, and also that by thee we being defended from the fear of our enemies may pass our time in rest and quietness; through the merits of Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

The Collect for Aid Against all Perils:

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Anthem: O God, the King of glory

O God, the King of glory, which hast exalted thy only son Jesus Christ with great triumph unto thy kingdom in heaven; we beseech thee, leave us not comfortless, but send to us thine Holy Ghost, to comfort us, and exalt us unto the same place whither our Saviour Christ is gone before; who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Ghost, now and evermore.
