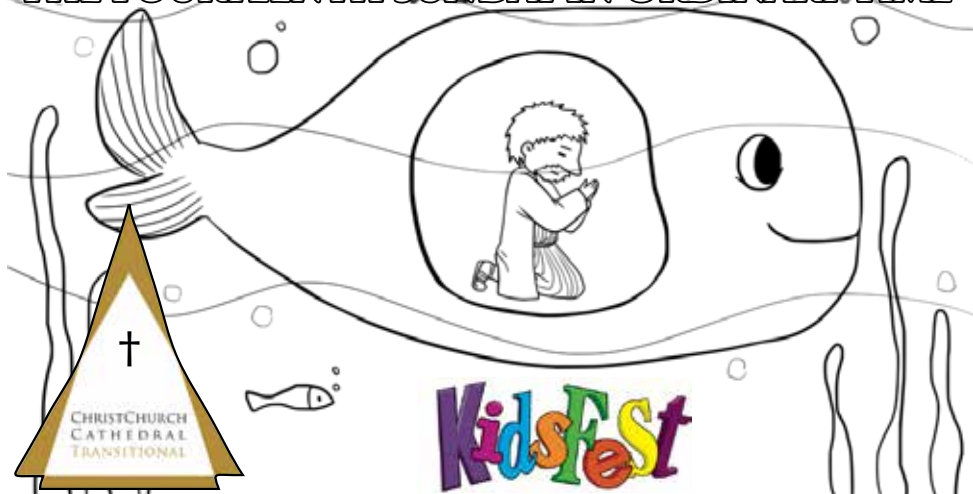

Cathedral Administrator Chris Oldham is on leave, returning at the start of August.

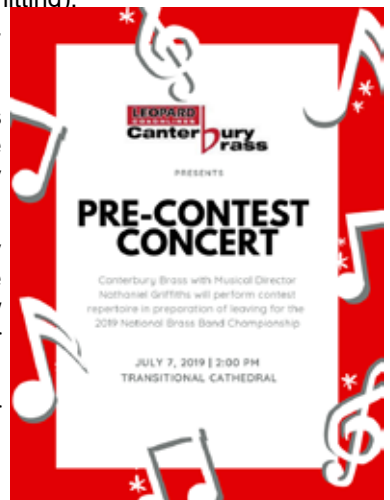

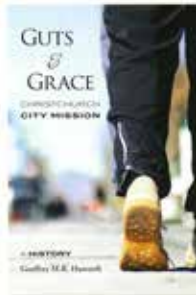

This is a new role at the Transitional Cathedral being created by the Dean, whose vision is to offer an enhanced experience for visitors to the Cathedral by explaining the story of the Transitional Cathedral and its place in the recovery of Christchurch. Our experience is that when the building is explained, visitors are a great deal more likely to encounter the Divine and appreciate more fully the resilience of Anglicans in particular and the people of Christchurch in general. Our vision is to offer 10 minute tours through the day for a small fee when the Transitional Cathedral is open, while ensuring that the Cathedral is always available for free to those who wish to come as pilgrims or worshippers to pray and to be with God.
