The more powerful 2011 (4*) was matured for 10 months in French oak barriques. Deep ruby, it is sturdy (14.5 per cent alcohol), ripe and savoury, with good complexity. Fleshy and full-flavoured, plummy, spicy and nutty, it’s well worth cellaring, but already drinking well.”
