## Spiral Rose Workshop

with RaNae Merrill

In this workshop, you will learn the techniques for drawing, coloring and sewing a spiral rose block, based on the techniques in RaNae's book Simply Amazing Spiral Quilts. (Books will be available for purchase at the workshop, but are not required.) We will sew one spiral rose block in class, and you will receive complete patterns to finish the block into your choice of the three projects shown in the following pages.

## Tools \& Materials for All Projects: (Please see individual pattern pages for fabric requirements)

$\qquad$ Basic sewing tools: pins, scissors, etc. Scissors for paper
Neutral colored thread for sewing 45 mm rotary cutter (please bring a self-closing one and be sure the blade is sharp)
$\qquad$ Rotary cutting ruler and mat Pen \& Pencil (with a FRESH eraser) 1 large Ziploc bag Two highlighter pens (pink, yellow or orange)
$\qquad$ Scotch tape 1 full roll of double-sided tape (permanent, not the removable kind. Scotch brand in the yellow \& red box is best. Buy it fresh at an office supply store; old tape breaks.) Masking or painter's tape (fresh) Add-a-Quarter tool with card (available for purchase in class) Seam roller (optional, but really helpful; available for purchase in class)

## Sewing Machine Set-up:

Bring your machine ready to sew with a new $75 / 11$ or $80 / 12$ needle. Use a foot that allows you to clearly see lines on the foundation, such as an open-toe foot, or a clear foot with a center-line mark. Please check your machine to make sure it is working properly before you bring it to class. Don't set up the machine at the beginning of class -- you'll need the table space for designing, then set up when you're ready to sew.

## About Translucent Foundation Material:

Spirals are sewn using paper piecing, so they require a foundation material to which you sew the fabric. I use foundation material that is translucent, which means you can see through it. Since you can see the lines from both sides, you put fabric on the front and sew from the back. This means that you don't have to think in mirror-image like you have to do on an opaque foundation. (Traditional paper-piecers take note!) Translucent foundation material costs a bit more than regular paper, but the time and frustration saved are more than worth it! For this workshop, a foundation will be provided for you, already printed on EQ Printables Foundation Sheets. Additional pre-printed templates may be purchased in class. Blank foundation sheets can also be purchased in class and through my online store.

| Foundation template on translucent material <br> (Provided in workshop. Read explanation on page 1.) | 3 sheets 8-1/2" x 11" |
| Foundation template on plain white paper <br> (Provided in workshop.) | 1 sheet 8-1/2" x 11" |
| Batting | $26^{\prime \prime} \times 50 "$ |

| Velcro (3/4" wide, for pillow closure) | $14 "$ strip |
| Batting (optional, if you want to quilt the front of the pillow) | $16^{\prime \prime} \times 16 "$ |

| Denim or Heavy Cotton Twill (bottom, top edge and handles) | $3 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$ |

| Fabric for lining (regular quilting-weight fabric) | $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}$ |
| Batting (bonded) | $3 / 8 \mathrm{yd} 40$ " wide |
| Topstitching thread - Can be jeans thread or hand-quilting thread |  |
| Thread for quilting - matching colors for background and rose |  |

A heavy-duty sewing machine needle for sewing denim \& topstitching
