


Hello Navy Yacht Club Family!!



Exciting news! Navy Yacht Club Long Beach has presented a challenge for the Walt Elliott Harbor Challenge trophy. This regatta is sponsored by the Association of San Pedro Bay Yacht Clubs as a competition between member clubs. Long Beach Yacht Club will be defending their 2019 victory and Cabrillo Beach Yacht Club is the challenger of record.

The terms of the challenge are that the skipper must be a flag officer or staff commodore of the challenging club (R/C Heinz Butner), the helm must be a member (Heinz again), and four of the eight crew must be members (Heinz, Greg Butner, Joe Russo and Tim Hohmann). We've also collected a few "ringers" to join our team: Zack Hanna, Karla Reinhardt, Chris Layne and Jared Gargano, all excellent sailors. We've got a very talented and experienced team and we're hoping to give the other clubs a run for their money.

This regatta will be sailed in Long Beach Sailing Foundation's Catalina 37s, the same boats used in the Congressional Cup and on the same Con Cup Stadium Course. There will be three races sailed on Saturday, August 7. So put on your Navy Yacht Club fan gear and come on down to Belmont Pier to watch what's sure to be a great show.

Windfall (Santa Cruz 33, John Setchell) continues to do well in the LBYC Catalina Island series. In the Ship Rock race on July 10-11, Windfall was 4<sup>th</sup> on the way over and 2<sup>nd</sup> on the Sunday race home. She's running 3rd in the series, only one point out of 2<sup>nd</sup> place. Two events (four races) remain in this series, Isthmus Cove on September 25-26 and the fall Long Point race on October 16-17.

On July 14 Raptor (J-109, Heinz Butner) and Renegade (Beneteau First 38s5, Ben Smith) competed in the Little Ships Fleet Beat the Heat race. Raptor took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in class A behind Dos Amigos Dos. Renegade won class B. With three races yet to sail, Raptor is currently 51 points behind Dos Amigos for the series prize and Renegade is in 6<sup>th</sup>. The next race in this series is the Shoreline Yacht Club Beat the Heat race on July 31.

In the Seal Beach Yacht Club Thursday night Pop Tops series #3, Raptor won class A2 with three Daily Firsts and Shadowfax (J-109, Chris Mewes) was 3<sup>rd</sup> in A2. Renegade took 2<sup>nd</sup> in class C with two Daily Firsts and Dawn Patrol (Catalina 30, Paul Turang) won class D with three Daily Firsts.

Raptor and Renegade are 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> in SLBYC's High Points standings, with Dawn Patrol cracking the top ten.

The next Navy Yacht Club race is the All Hands regatta on September 11<sup>th</sup>. This will be the final race of the Long Beach Harbor High Points Series. We expect to be back to normal for post-race entertainment, refreshments and awards at the club. We will also be hosting a layover dinner & awards ceremony for the Argosy regatta (Bahia Corinthian and American Legion YCs) on September 18. We will be looking for a few volunteers to support both of those events, so please mark your calendar and consider spending a couple of hours helping out.


