

The 2021 Sail Racing season is has yet to get underway. Everything has been getting canceled about two weeks out from the scheduled race. Next opportunity is the February 6th Saturday Sailors race with two races scheduled that day.

Tuesday Salty Sailors: NYCLB continues with our informal racing with the Tuesday Salty Sailors throughout the year. We still are not able to have meetings before our races. But, we have been getting more of the non-boat owners hooked up with boats by phone and getting more people out sailing. If you would like to join us as crew or boat owner send a note to the race chair "HeinzLB@icloud.com", we will included you on the race notice/results email.

Tuesday 22 December: We again had 6 boats out racing. Rode Rage, a Benteau 36.7, joint us for the first time - and won the race. We sailed course #55, a 5.4 NM race. Wind was light but held up through the end of the race. The first leg from the start at Mark 38 to Mark 27 was a tight reach. It was "follow the leader" until Mark 27. At that point the first boats around the mark went left. Rode Rage, Raptor, and California Star went right - out towards the wall. They then tacked to Port with a plan to get over an anchored container ship. Raptor sailed into a lightening breeze and a couple of headers and had to tack away from the container ship - Rode Rage and California Star banked more distance on the previous tack and easily cleared the ship.

The boats that initially went left were surprised that right side boats gained enough to cross ahead before Mark 37. The last legs, downwind legs from Mark 37 to Mark 38 and the A Mark (Alamitos Bay entrance buoy) were "follow the leader" legs. With their 140% headsail, Rode Rage extended their lead all the way to the finish.

Tuesday 29 December: For the last Salty Sailors race of the year we had 6 boats racing. The course was #35, at 4.5 NM. Wind was a bit light, 6 knots at the start. Macs was displaying their light wind speed even before the start. First leg was a deep reach to Mark 33 on the beach. We headed to the beach to better see the snow covered mountains. After rounding Mark 33 it was a long beat to Mark 30 on the outer break wall. Raptor, always last to start looked upwind and saw a line of boats. Macs way out in front, followed by California Star. Shadowfax closely followed by Rode Rage - and both pointing high. Raptor tacked to take the left side of the course. The rest of the fleet kept going out to the right following Macs. Raptor didn't tack back until she got to the break wall. The wind by then had picked up to about 10 knots. The whole fleet came back to gather at Mark 30. First around was Macs, followed by Raptor, Rode Rage, Shadowfax and California Star. Lucky Boy was following their own course. On the way back to the finish at Mark 38, Macs headed straight for the Mark, Rode Rage pinned Raptor to the right along the break wall, Shadowfax jibed immediately and went to the left. California Star followed Rode Rage and Raptor. Raptor escaped by jibing behind Rode Rage. At the finish it was Macs with a convincing win. Raptor, Shadowfax, and Rode Rage finished in a close pack. In the lighter winds at the finish, California Star lost some ground and finished behind the pack.

Tuesday 5 January: We had 6 boats racing again. The course was #37, at 6.1 NM. Wind was better than we expected - a good 10 knots. First leg was a beat to a starboard rounding of Mark 31 on the outer break wall. After rounding Mark 31 it was a one legged beat to Mark 27. Lots of ships anchored - had to find a clear slot between them. The leg looked like it might be a reach but ended up being another one sided beat. back to Mark 38, not much passing. Wind came up again to 10-14 knots making

Most boats make it on one tack. Next leg was down into the light wind (still 6 knots) at Mark 39 near Shoreline. That was as close as the boats got to each other - they then started to spread out. On the long reach back to Mark 38, not much passing. Wind came up again to 10-14 knots making for a brisk fun ride. Raptor finally got by Swell Lover. California Star didn't catch Macs. Rode Rage nursed a broken outhaul around the course but managed to stay out of reach of Raptor.



Tuesday 12 January: The fire station was flying the GALE WARNING flags. We got Raptor ready to go out. Macs was already on the way out of the harbor when she got the call that we weren't going to join them. Macs reported after their sail - gusts to 40 knots - wild sailing.
