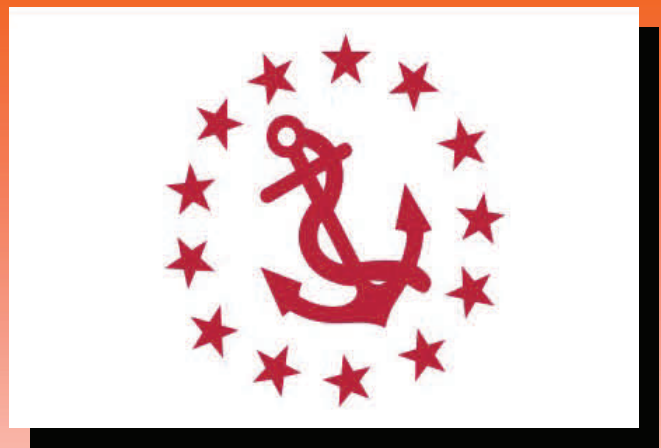

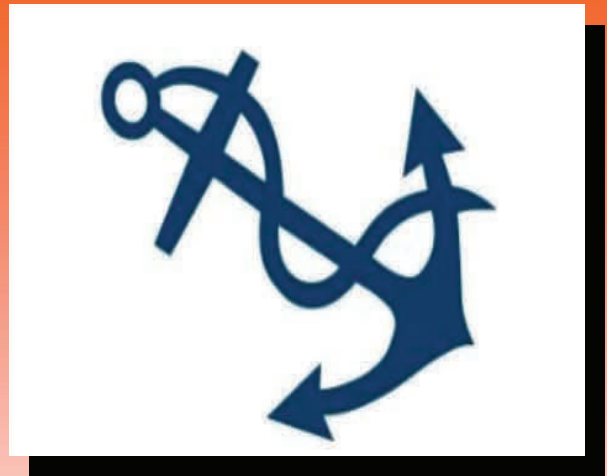

Safety & Seamanship – how’s your knot knowledge?

A critical skill for any sailor “worth his (or her, or their) salt” is the ability to correctly and quickly tie a variety of knots, and to know which knot is best suited for a particular purpose. Among the essential sailing/boating knots are:

Stopper knots that prevent a line from running free such as the classic Figure Eight, Double Overhand or Stevedore knots or my current favorite, the Ashley Stopper which makes a nice, bulky knot that’s easy to untie but won’t shake out accidentally

Loops like the Bowline or Alpine Butterfly (particularly useful for putting a loop or eye into the middle of a line if you don’t have a free end)

Bends used to tie two lines together like the Square Knot, Sheet Bend or Fisherman’s Knot

Hitches for securing a line to an object like a cleat, bollard or railing. Useful and popular hitches include the Clove Hitch (and Clove Hitch on a Cleat), Halyard Hitch, Anchor Hitch and Buntline Hitch

If you want to improve your knot tying knowledge and skill, there are many excellent resources on YouTube that show you step-by-step how to tie the knot. Another excellent instructional aid is the Animated Knots website (animatedknots.com)

This regatta is sailed in the Long Beach Sailing Foundation's Catalina 37s (the Congressional Cup boats) and the racecourse is just off of Belmont Pier. Unfortunately we missed out on this years race after we had to withdraw when one more crew person caught Covid. We will work hard to put together an even stronger team with more depth for next year. This years race was again won by Long Beach YC with Alamitos Bay YC second. Seal Beach YC 3rd, Cabrillo Beach YC 4th and Shoreline 5th.

Armed Forces Day Regatta

Navy Yacht Club's first race of the year was the Armed Forces Day regatta on May 7. Although the turnout was light, the participants had a great day on the water and at the social event/awards ceremony at the club after the race. First in A spinnaker was Seal Beach's Dos Amigos Dos followed by Bilbo Baggins. In third was NYCLB's Raptor. Raptor also told the best post race stories and was lauded by the participants for the entertaining tall stories/lies.

The B Spinnaker fleet shared a start with the non-spin class. Fiat Lux was the spin winner and Windhaven was first in the non-spin with Bellissima second. Now that all of the area Yacht Clubs have had their opening days, we shouldn't have anymore scheduling conflicts that have limited the participation in this years Harbor Series races.

Other Local Racing

The Seal Beach YC's Thursday evening Pop Top series began on May 5. The Pop Tops races finish just off the NYCLB dock around 1900 or so, so consider coming down to the club to cheer on the racers and watch the sunset. NYCLB boats participating include the J109's Raptor and Shadowfax, the Far40 Jazz, Cat30 Dawn Patrol and BEN38S5 Renegade. After 4 races of the 6 race series here are the results for NYCLB boats; in the PHRF AA fleet Jazz is in 2nd, in the A fleet Raptor is in 1st and Shadowfax is in 3rd, in the C fleet Dawn Patrol is in 1st and Renegade is in 2nd.

Little Ships Fleet has instituted a new Offshore Series for PHRF boats. The first race of this series was held on May 14 with another scheduled for August 6. The course will be out to Platform Edith and back. Navy Yacht Club also supports the Long Beach Harbor Series. Upcoming races include:

As a reminder, the criteria for the Trident award are as follows:

Purpose: To promote and encourage racing among NYCLB boats and recognize active, successful racing programs.

Eligible Boats: Any boat owned by a NYCLB member which registers for a qualifying event under the NYCLB burgee.

Qualifying Events: Any event on the ASPBYC racing calendar which includes PHRF classes. Note: A boat will be scored for sailing in a one-design class as long as PHRF classes are available at the event.

Scoring: Trident is a high-points competition. The final scored race of the year is the Navy Day Regatta in October. Races after the Navy Day Regatta will be scored for the following year. Boats earn points as follows:

One point for any qualifying event that an eligible boat participates (including DNS, DNF, DSQ or RET - does not include DNC)

Bonus of 0.5 points for Long Beach Harbor Series events hosted by LSF, SYC or SLBYC (not including NYCLB regattas which carry a 1 point bonus)

Bonus of 1 point for NYCLB regattas

Bonus of 0.5 points for class win in any regatta

Bonus of 3 points for winner of Navy Day Trophy (top NYCLB boat in the Navy Day Regatta)

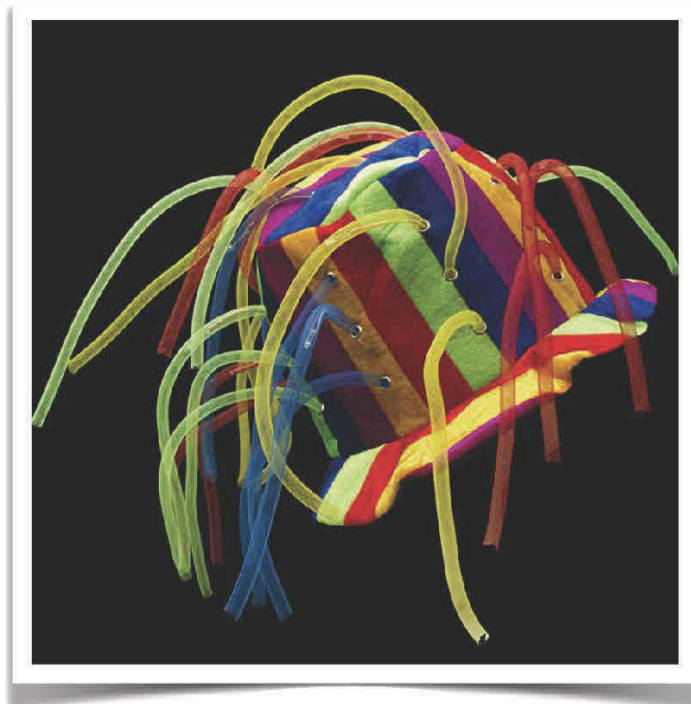

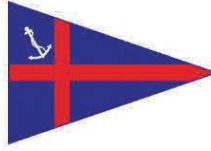
