


I hope you all take the opportunity to meet and greet our new members of our NYCLB family!

To all you wonderful members of Navy Yacht Club Long Beach.



No NYCLB weekend races in June but our members continue to race locally. Windfall (Santa Cruz 33, John Setchell) took 2nd place in LBYC's race to Emerald Bay on June 12 and 4th place on the race back to Long Beach on June 13. After four races Windfall is in 2nd place in PHRF C in the Catalina Island series. Next race weekend is Ship Rock on July 10-11, good luck John & crew!

In Little Ships Fleet's Murray Gordon Memorial race on June 5, Renegade (Beneteau First 38s5, Ben Smith) won her class (PHRF B) and Raptor (J-109, R/C Heinz Butner) took 2nd in PHRF A. This race is part of the Long Beach Harbor High Points series, where Raptor is currently in 2nd place and Renegade is in 8th with 4 of 8 races completed. There are two Harbor High Points series races in July, Beat the Heat (LSFYC) on July 17 and Dog Days of Summer (SYCLB) on July 31.

In Thursday night SLBYC Pop Tops action, in PHRF A2 Raptor took 2nd place and Shadowfax (J-109, Chris Mewes) took 5th for Series 2. Windfall was 2nd in PHRF B and Renegade took 2nd in PHRF C. In PHRF D Dawn Patrol (Catalina 30, Paul Turang) won the series with three Daily Firsts, throwing out a 2nd place. Before the 6/23 race, Raptor lies 2nd in SLBYC season High Points. Renegade is in 4th and Dawn Patrol knocking on the top ten at #12.

The next Navy Yacht Club race is the All Hands regatta on September 11th. We expect to be back to normal for post-race entertainment, refreshments and awards at the club. We will also be hosting a layover dinner & awards ceremony for the Argosy regatta (Bahia Corinthian and American Legion YCs) on September 18. We will be looking for a few volunteers to support both of those events, so please mark your calendar and consider spending a couple of hours helping out.

And finally – we have retrieved a number of NYCLB's perpetual racing trophies from the Naval Weapons Station. We're looking at the most appropriate ways to repurpose and display these beautiful and historic artifacts in our new clubhouse layout. However they have long been in storage and not maintained for several years so some are badly tarnished. If anyone has the expertise (and time & patience) to help restore these trophies to a more ship-shape state, please let Tim Hohmann or Tony Rietdyk know.






MEMBERS CORNER

This Old Boat

Since purchasing the 40 year old Tollycraft 30 ft power boat 2 years ago, I have spent some time (and \$\$\$) in maintaining the mechanics and upgrading components in order to enjoy the boat and stay on top of the functionality. As with all boat owners, I want it to last as long as possible. Fortunately, the 2 big gas V8s have been rebuilt and are purring like 2 big fat cats.

But as with an automobile, over time, components wear out. Especially anything involving rotating items. Such was the recent case with a propeller shaft cutlass bearing. The bearing is the sleeve that resides inside the prop shaft support strut thru which the prop shaft runs thru. The bearing keeps the shaft aligned from engine to prop. The bearing is just a brass tube with a serrated rubber inner liner. The tube is press fitted into the strut. (see an example at right).



One day, while out in the harbor, I heard banging under the hull at the left engine. Shutting down the engine and heading back to the slip on the right engine, I thought that I had picked up some kelp. Once back in the slip, I called the diver to come at first chance to take a look and remove any obstructions. Two days later, he called and told me that not only was there kelp wrapped on the shaft but that the cutlass bearing rubber insert had been pushed out of the sleeve. &%\$##@! Now I have to get the boat pulled out to pull the prop and install a new bearing!

"...not to worry amigo!" the diver tells me "I know a guy who can install the new bearing underwater!" WHAT! So I call Bob Harris from *Pro Tech Dive Works* who tells me that he has tools and equipment to remove the old and install the new bearing without moving the boat from the slip. After determining the correct size of the bearing to replace, Bob shows up with his assistant (the diver) and hydraulic equipment that pushes out the old and pushes in the new bearing.

After removing the 17" dia (the size of a hub cap) bronze propeller, hooking up the jig and hydraulic pins to push out the old bearing, then reversing the jig to push in the new bearing, the job was done. However, the inspection of both props revealed bent blades! They being 40 years old, it was not unexpected. &%\$##@! Now I have to buy new props!



"...not to worry amigo!" Bob tells me "I know a guy who can recondition the propellers!" WHAT! So I call Gary at *Wilmington Propellers* who tells me that they can straighten the blades, balance and polish the props to a like new condition. Boat performance will improve as well he says.

I got the props back the following week for the diver to install and me to test. There was a definite improvement in performance and smoothness of operation of the boat!

There will probably be some other item to eventually wear out and have to deal with, but as long as one guy knows another guy that can fix it, all is good!
