SPONSORS- Duties and Responsibilities

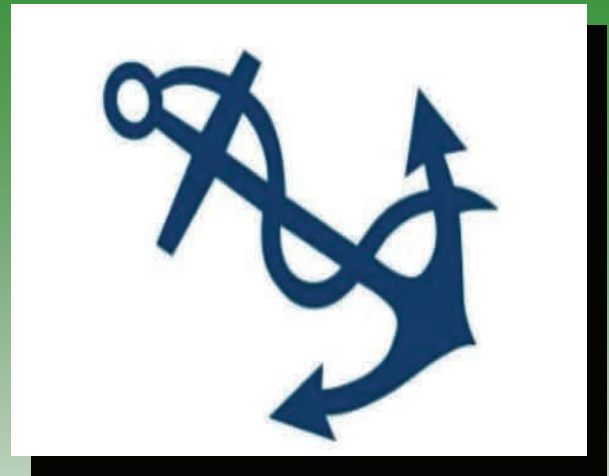

Unfortunately, Pete Axelrod has had to resign as Fleet Captain. In accordance with the by-laws the board has offered me the opportunity to fill the seat and I have accepted.

I expect to have two primary areas of focus as Fleet Captain for the remainder of the year. One, near and dear to my heart, is seamanship and safety at sea. I'll try to use this space in the Scuttlebutt to provide useful and interesting information, and we may look at staging some educational events.

The second area of focus is our cruise-out program. I'm interested in finding out if members are interested in organized NYCLB cruise-outs and if so, when & where you'd be interested in going and what sort of event formats you'd be interested in. If there's significant interest in doing these events we'll stand up a Cruising Committee to schedule and organize our cruising program, so if you're interested in volunteering for the committee please get in touch.

So what is a "cruise-out"? A cruise-out event involves NYCLB boats traveling in company to a destination to socialize, explore and mingle with the "natives." A typical cruise-out might include a visit to a local (or not so local) yacht club where we'll

work to coordinate slip/mooring space and try to set up some activities to meet and socialize with members of the host club. Cruise-out activities could also involve a Friday evening raft-up at "Little Catalina" (in the lee of the oil islands in LB outer harbor), an excursion to the real Catalina or an expedition up or down the coast.

We have one cruise-out tentatively on our calendar, a visit to Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club in Newport Beach on May 14-15. We're arranging for several slips at BCYC and discussing social events in conjunction. Newport is an easy drive for many members so even those who don't want to cruise down for the weekend can participate in the social activities. If anyone would like to step up as Cruise Captain for this event please let me know.

As with most things in the club, the success of a cruise-out program will depend on volunteers interested in running the program and members interested in participating. Our objective would be to have the Cruising Committee make plans and coordinate pre-arrangements for events and assign a Cruise Captain to each event to help coordinate during the cruise. The Cruising Committee will also help with arrangements for any cruise-ins by other clubs to NYCLB, and will help to keep records and make recommendations for the Passagemaker Trophy to be awarded at the annual meeting.

Race Director

Racing activity continued in February. In the Seal Beach YC's Saturday Sailors series, Dawn Patrol (Catalina 30, Paul Turang) is tied for first in PHRF D after two races. Renegade (Beneteau 38s5, Ben Smith) is fifth in PHRF C; Shadowfax (J-109, Chris Mewes) is 2nd and Raptor (J-109, Heinz Butner) is tied for 4th in PHRF A2 (after missing one race); and Jazz (Farr 40, Mark Itnyre) is 4th in PHRF AA. There are three races remaining in this series on February 26, March 12 and March 26.

Long Beach boats were well-represented in the SCYA Midwinter Regatta J-109 class races run by California Yacht Club in Marina Del Rey. Raptor took first or second in every race except the first and took 2nd place for the regatta, 3 points behind nemesis Fuzzy Logic from LBYC.

Jazz came in 5th in the Midwinter Farr 40 class regatta run by LBYC, and also came in 7th in PHRF A in LBYC's Two Gates Pursuit series.

Last year we fielded a team for the Walt Elliott Challenge Trophy sponsored by the Association of San Pedro Bay Yacht Clubs. We put together a terrific team and had a great time. Long Beach Yacht Club won the regatta and will defend the trophy this year. Alamitos Bay Yacht Club has issued a challenge of record and Navy is again planning to field a team for this event. The regatta will be sailed on May 15 in Long Beach Sailing Foundation's Catalina 37s, the same boats used for the Congressional Cup and on the same Con Cup stadium course. So mark your calendar and plan to come down to Belmont Pier to cheer us on!

Last month we announced that we'd be instituting a scoring system for the Top Gun trophy to recognize participation and success by NYCLB racing skippers. I've since found out that the Top Gun trophy was deeded to the club specifically for recognition of race committee volunteers, so of course we will honor the Deed of Gift and use it for that purpose. However, we still want to recognize our racers so we'll use the scoring system described to award the newly established Trident trophy. Award and backstory on the trophy will be presented at the annual meeting in November.

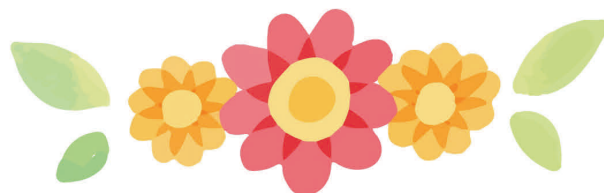
