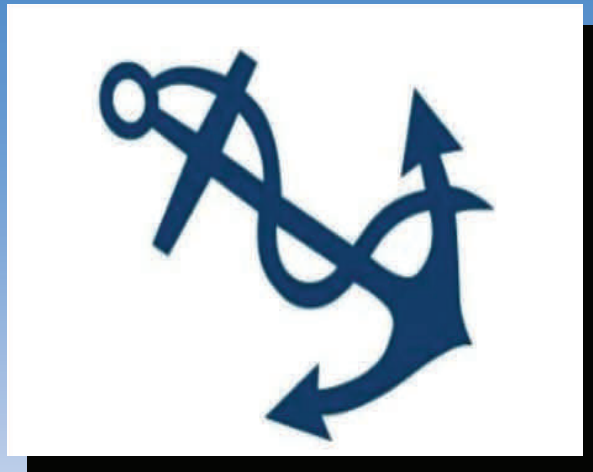

As we roll into summer and “high season” for Southern California boating, have you checked your required safety equipment recently? The Coast Guard publishes a handy pamphlet that describes the minimum required safety equipment according to U.S. law (see link below). In summary, the pamphlet addresses:

Life Jackets. You must have one USCG-approved wearable life jacket (type I, II or III) for each person onboard, plus one throw able (type IV). Children under 13 must wear an appropriately sized life jacket any time you’re underway and the child is above deck. Life jackets not being worn should be readily accessible (and passengers should know where they are stowed), and a throw able PFD should be available on deck whenever you’re underway.

Visual Distress Signals. You must carry appropriate day and night visual distress signals. If you carry pyrotechnic devices (flares or orange smoke signals) they must be USCG-approved, in serviceable condition (not expired) and readily accessible. In recent years the Coast Guard has also approved electric distress lights as an option for night distress signals. These USCG-approved electric lights combined with a USCG-approved orange distress flag meet the day/night distress signal requirements without having to worry about expiration dates or storage and disposal of pyro devices.

Fire extinguishers. Specific number, size and type are specified based on boat size. Make sure yours are USCG-approved and check the state of charge regularly. Fire extinguishers should be readily accessible and are best mounted near the exits from the cabin – you never want to have go toward a fire to get a fire extinguisher.

Gasoline Safety. Positive mechanical ventilation and backfire flame control are required for any boat with a permanently installed gasoline engine, generator or below-deck fuel tank.

Sound Producing Devices. The Navigation Rules require sound signals for maneuvering when risk of collision exists and in restricted visibility, and sound signals are also useful when in distress. Every vessel should have a whistle or horn, and depending on the length of your boat you may need a bell and a gong.

Navigation Lights. Your boat should be equipped as necessary to display the lights required by the Navigation Rules for your vessel. Have you verified that all of your navigation lights are working?

Pollution Control. All vessels 26 feet or longer with machinery spaces must display a “Discharge of Oil Prohibited” placard in the machinery spaces or at the bilge pump control station and must display a placard notifying passengers of garbage discharge restrictions (which depend on the type of garbage and distance from shore – note that discharge of plastics is prohibited in all areas).

Marine Sanitation Devices. If you have installed toilet facilities, you must have a USCG-certified MSD. When operating within a No Discharge Zone (typically within 3 miles of land) the MSD must be secured in such a manner that prevents any discharge – locking or zip-tying the overboard valve or locking a 3-way valve to the holding tank, or a similar method.

Bahia Corinthian Cruise-Out

We are planning a cruise-out to Bahia Corinthian Yacht Club in Newport Beach on May 13-15. Several boats have already signed up and a few other members have expressed interest in driving down to Newport Beach for social activities. We're planning for an informal, no-host happy hour on Friday evening, dinner (no-host, but we'll be making a group reservation) in the BCYC dining room and a Sunday brunch (also no-host) at BCYC. If you're interested in participating and especially if you'd like to dock your boat at BCYC please get in touch with me ASAP.

Walt Elliott Challenge

For the second consecutive year Navy Yacht Club is fielding a team for the Association of San Pedro Bay Yacht Clubs' Walt Elliott Challenge on Sunday, May 15. This regatta will be sailed in the Long Beach Sailing Foundation's Catalina 37s (the Congressional Cup boats). The racecourse will be just off of Belmont Pier so come down in the afternoon and cheer on the Navy team!

Armed Forces Day Regatta

Navy Yacht Club's first race of the year will be the Armed Forces Day regatta on May 7. The race will be followed by a social event/awards ceremony at the club. Contact Race Chair Heinz Butner or Principal Race Officer Tony Rietdyk if you'd like to help out with Race Committee or with setup for the social.

Other Local Racing

Long Beach YC's Wet Wednesday evening series started in March and continues through September. Seal Beach YC's Thursday evening Pop Top series begins on May 5. Pop Tops races finish just off the NYCLB dock around 1900 or so, so consider coming down to the club to cheer on the racers and watch the sunset. Little Ships Fleet has instituted a new Offshore Series for PHRF boats. The first race of this series will be held on May 14 with another scheduled for August 6. The course will be out to Platform Edith and back. Note that LSF may be using our yard area for their awards presentations on those days.

Navy Yacht Club also supports the Long Beach Harbor Series. Upcoming races include:

The Saturday evening awards ceremony and BBQ dinner has traditionally been hosted by NYCLB. We encourage Long Beach racers to consider entering one or both legs of this regatta.

ARMED FORCES DAY REGATTA, MAY 7, 2022
NOTICE OF RACE

1. **Rules:** This event is governed by the rules defined in the current edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing.
2. **Sailing Instructions & Course:** NYCLB Course Chart OF 2022 and associated Sailing Instructions will be used. These will be available on the NYCLB website (nyclb.org). Amendments will be posted to the Official Notice Board and NYCLB website not later than 1800 of the day before the race.
3. **Eligibility and Entry:**
 - 3.1. This event is open to members of all SCYA Yacht Clubs with a valid PHRF certificate. The following classes are invited to participate: Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker and any One-Design Class of 3 or more boats. All boats shall use their Area C RLC handicaps. A boat wishing to race Non-Spinnaker shall use the non-spinnaker offset rating printed on her PHRF certificate.
 - 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form or entering online on the NYCLB website and submitting the required fee of \$15 (**\$20 if entering after April 25**) to one of the addresses below not later than May 6, 2022.
 - 3.3. This event is part of the Long Beach Harbor High Point Series.
4. **Schedule:** One race will be sailed on May 7, 2022. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first class is 1155.
5. **Penalty System:**
 - 5.1. RRS 44.1 is changed such that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty
 - 5.2. A boat may take a post-race penalty as described in U.S. Sailing Prescription Appendix V2
6. **Risk Statement & Waiver of Liability:**
 - 6.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
 - 6.2. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
7. **Prizes & Social:** Trophies will be presented at NYCLB following the race. There will be a no-host bar and refreshments.

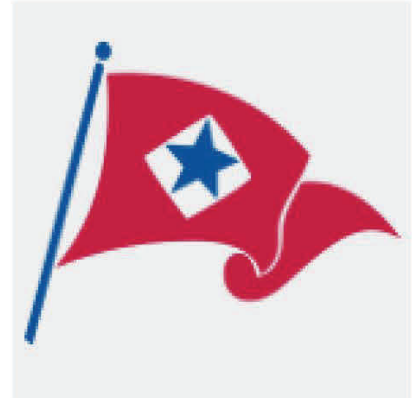
